JESUS THE GOOD SHEPHERD

Today is called Good Shepherd Sunday. In today's gospel (John 10:11-18) Jesus called himself the Good Shepherd. He said: "I am the Good Shepherd, I know my sheep and mine know me." As God's children we are the sheep of Jesus. He knows us. He knows when we are hungry and thirsty. He knows when we are weak and wounded. He knows our worries and concerns, our problems, and difficulties, and he always comes to our help. John 10:11 says- "the Good Shepherd lays down his life for his sheep." Jesus in his selfless love and care for us sacrificed his life for our salvation.

David in Psalm 23 brought out very clearly the image of God as a Good shepherd. He said "The Lord is my Shepherd; there is nothing I shall want.... Goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life...." This is a very popular psalm. This psalm teaches us that God as our shepherd loves us and takes absolute care of us. He provides, protects, and preserves us as his flock. Like David in Psalm 23 we should have attitude of trust in the loving care of God. God can never stop being good and loving towards us. In Jeremiah 31:3 God said, "I love you with an everlasting love."

Again, today Jesus teaches us about good leadership. Using himself as an image of a Good Shepherd, he wants us to imitate him in his leadership qualities: qualities of love, care and selfless service. We are all shepherds in various capacities: as pastors, as political leaders, as doctors and nurses in the hospitals, as teachers in schools, as parents at homes, as lawyers in the courts, as employers of labour etc. In our various fields of life we are shepherds as long as we render services to others. Do we show love and care to our flock? Do we have the heart of compassion as Jesus had? We are called to be good shepherds in imitation of Jesus. We are called to imitate Jesus in his humility, patience and selflessness in our services to others. We should be ready to lay down our lives for our flock as Jesus did. Sacrificing for the welfare of others is a mark of authentic service and true leadership.

God is good all the time, All the time God is good!


