WE ARE THE SALT OF THE EARTH AND THE LIGHT OF THE WORLD In today's gospel (Matt.5:13-16) Jesus called us to

be the salt for the people of our time. Salt has the

duty of making food sweet, bringing out the best in food. We are meant to carry out the function of salt- to make the world a sweet and a better place; to bring out the best in our society. Jesus equally called us the light of the world. We are meant to be light shining in the darkness of our society, helping people to find their ways to fullness of life in God. Our light of good works must shine before others that they may give glory to God. In the first reading of today (Isaiah 58:7-10), Isaiah tells us practically how to be the salt of the earth and the light of the world. He said, 'share your food with the hungry; shelter the oppressed and the homeless; clothe the naked; remove from your midst oppression, false accusation, and malicious speech.' This implies meeting the needs of the poor and carrying out social justice. Christians realize their true vocation in caring for the poor and in the implementation of social justice. The story of the good Samaritan (Luke 10:25-37) is a good example of how to be salt and light to the world. Charitable actions we perform brighten the world, makes the world a sweeter and a better place to live in. Standing out to defend the course of justice in the society is another good example of how to be light and salt in the society. The church is the voice of the voiceless and the defender of the defenceless, and we are members of the church. So, we are called to stand for justice always, to be peace makers, solution providers, light bearers to others. Our life of integrity, sincerity and charity can be a bible others can read and get converted. Our good conducts, actions and words can bring others out from the darkness of misconduct and misbehaviour. Our light must shine into the life of others. This is the mandate Jesus gave us by calling us to be his followers. If we don't carry out these duties, we shall become like salt that has lost its taste and is of no use again or we shall become like a lamp light put under bushel basket and nobody sees with it. We are called to be active Christians and not inactive or lukewarm Christians. May the good Lord bless our efforts and help us to live true to our Christian vocation.
