

Blessed Virgin Mary
A Prayer to Our Beloved Mother

The Blessed Virgin Mary offered the disciples her prayers, motherly care, and witness. She continues to offer us her motherly love and interces-

sion. During this month of May, let us rediscover her maternal role in each of our lives. Beloved Mother, I come to you with prayers for healing of mind, body and spirit. I ask you to hear my special concern and to place my needs before your Son who you nurtured and cared for with all your heart. Help me to release all fears and doubts that cause me anxiety and bring me peace and comfort through your blessed intercession.

Let me be receptive of God's will and help me to learn compassion through my suffering. Teach me to love others as brothers and sisters in Christ. Give me the strength and understanding to forgive and to receive others' forgiveness. Blessed Mother, help me to grow closer to your Son in everything I do. Renew my spirit and restore my soul through your intercession. I seek your guidance and protection, remembering these words: "Create a pure heart in me, O God, and put a new and loyal spirit in me". All this I pray in Jesus' name. Amen.

Fifth Sunday of Easter (Lect 54-Year C)

At the end of today's first reading, the author of Acts reports that God "opened the door of faith to the Gentiles" (Acts 14:27). Yes, even a people regarded as unclean are invited to believe. It recalls how Jesus invited others to believe throughout his life. He did not force faith upon anyone, nor did he reject anyone for their lack of faith. He invited everyone to come, follow him, and find faith for themselves. From the first disciples at the Sea of Galilee to the good thief on the cross, Jesus opened the door of faith to everyone he encountered. Likewise, he has opened it for us and we are called now to hold it open for others. We do so when we love one another, which is what Jesus calls us to do in today's Gospel. We do so when we accept the challenge of loving one another as he did—selflessly willing to sacrifice ourselves for others. After all, this is literally what he is about to do when he says these words at the Last Supper. We do so when we do for the least of our brothers and sisters as we would for Jesus, for we are called to see him when we see those in need. Doing so, in fact, opens the door of faith for those others, and for all those who see our love in action.
