

JESUS WANTS TO COME INTO YOUR LIFE

Advent is a time of preparation to commemorate the first coming of Jesus into the world, that is, Christmas. During advent we pray and invite Jesus anew into our lives. We all need Jesus. We cannot do without him. Life is meaningless without Jesus. Whoever has him has everything. And whoever does not have him, it doesn't matter what else the person has. Jesus wants to come into our lives for our own good. Rev. 3:20, He said "I am at the door knocking if you open for me, I will come in and dine with you".

The church today encourages us to open our hearts and to invite Jesus to the blind spots of our lives; to invite him to strengthen the weak areas of our lives. Since we all have imperfections, we need Jesus to perfect us. The church equally uses the time of advent to remind us of the second coming of Christ; to remind us of the end of our lives, and the need for us to prepare for that

St. Paul in the second reading (Rom.13:11-14) educates us on how to get prepared both for Christmas and for the second coming of Jesus. He tells us to avoid the works of darkness and put on the light of Christ. Works of darkness means all forms of sinful behaviors. In the gospel (Matt.24:37-44) Jesus lays emphasis on his second coming. He tells us to stay awake always. To stay awake means to be in the state of grace always. To stay awake means to be in good relationship with God. Jesus does not want us to be spiritually asleep for we do not know the day of His second coming. Nobody knows the time of his/her death. And immediately death strikes, what comes next is judgement. The effort to save our souls is a personal effort. Your friends or relatives may not help you much. You must make effort yourself. You cannot depend on the effort of others for your salvation. That's why Jesus said in today's gospel that on the day of his second coming, two men will be in the field, one will be taken and the other left; two women will be grinding at the mill, one will be taken, and the other left. The righteous will be taken and the unrighteous left behind for destruction. So, each person must make effort.

The best way to get prepared both for Christmas and for Jesus second comings is to go for the sacrament of reconciliation. On December 6th, we are going to have advent penance service here in our Parish. It is a precious time to reconcile with our God. Everybody is encouraged to take part in this spiritual exercise. Jesus comes to us every weekend at the table of the Eucharist. As you receive him today ask him to transform your life for better.
