

Father Cally has met with the Parish Council and the Finance Council and collectively identified two parish projects that not only need our attention but are financially outside of the current budget. They are placement of an AED(Automated External Defibrillator) and the replacement of the screen doors on the north side of the rectory. Catholic Mutual our insurance carrier has strongly suggested we obtain an AED. Because of recent attempts to break into the rectory, securing the doors on the north side of the rectory is necessary. Cost for the AED is \$1600 (the Knights of Columbus have already pledged \$500 toward the purchase). The replacement of the current doors with strong secure doors could be between \$2500 to \$3500 with parishioners that have offered to do the construction work. A special offering will be addressed this weekend with more information.
