PREPARE THE WAY OF THE LORD

Today is the second Sunday of Advent. Advent is a time to prepare for Christmas. Prophets Isaiah in the first reading (Is 40:1-5,9-11), and John the Baptist in the gospel (Mark1:1-8) told the people: "Prepare the way of the Lord, make straight his paths." Both prophets are calling us to repentance to be ready to welcome the Lord.

Isaiah said: Fill up the valleys. Valleys represent our lack, our dark sides, our bad habits, our hidden faults. We are called by Isaiah to remove those bad habits and replace them with virtues.

Isaiah equally said: Bring low every mountain and hill. As valleys represent our hidden faults, mountains and hills represent those faults we would like to show. An example is pride. Pride is the number one of the seven capital sins. Jesus can hardly dwell in a proud heart. We must therefore practice humility. Humility helps us to acknowledge our limitations just like John the Baptist who in today's gospel confessed that Jesus is mightier than him.

Isaiah again said: make straight the crooked ways and make smooth the rough ways. The crooked ways and rough ways in our lives are our acts of deception and lies, our insincerity. Isaiah and John the Baptist call upon us to repent of this and embrace truth and justice.

Advent is equally a time to prepare for the second coming of Lord. St. Peter in the second reading (2Peter 3:8-14) emphasized on this. He said that only life of holiness will get us into God's kingdom. He encouraged us to remain spotless and blameless at the final coming of our Lord.

The sacrament of reconciliation is one major instrument we use in preparing for Christmas and for the second coming of Jesus. We have Advent penance service this week on Thursday. Endeavour to be present.
