Christmas Carol of Nine Lessons Tuesday, Dec 20th 5:00 p.m. Followed with potluck dinner



John the Baptist was sent by God to be the forerunner of Jesus Christ. He came to prepare the people and get them ready for the coming of Jesus.

John the Baptist was a great man. Jesus said of him in Luke 7:28 "Of all those born of women none is greater than John". John's greatness lies in his humility. His mission was to promote Jesus, not himself. And this job he did very well. In today's gospel he said of Jesus "I am baptizing you with water for repentance, but the one who is coming after me is mightier than I. I am not worthy to carry his sandals. He will baptize you with Holy Spirit and fire." This is an act of humility. Humility makes us know our limitations and acknowledge someone greater than us.

In John 1:29 pointing at Jesus, John the Baptist told the people "Behold the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world." John the Baptist came to present Jesus to the world as the Savior of the world and he did exactly that. He was faithful to his mission. John could have claimed to be the Messiah, but he never did that. In John 3:30, talking about Jesus, John the Baptist said, "He will increase, and I will decrease." John understood very well his duty and he knew that once Jesus comes on stage, he will disappear from the stage. And that was exactly what happened. Immediately Jesus began his public ministry, John was arrested and killed by Herod. That was how he decreased out of existence.

There are two things the church wants us to do today. Number one is to imitate the humility and simplicity of John the Baptist. Number two is to listen to the message of John the Baptist. And John's message is the message of repentance. John the Baptist said "Repent for the kingdom of God is close at hand." This message of John is echoing in every church all over the world today as we prepare for Christmas.

Advent is a time to look inward: it is a time for selfquestioning. Am I in good standing with God? Do I relate well with myself and neighbors? Are there areas of my life that need a change? Advent is a time for self-examination, a time to speak the truth to oneself and make necessary adjustments.

When John the Baptist was preaching repentance to the people of Israel, people were coming for

baptism and he was baptizing them, and their sins were being forgiven. Now we don't need baptism again for we have been baptized and we can't receive baptism twice. Jesus gave us the sacrament of reconciliation through which the sins committed after baptism are forgiven. We are going to have Advent confession here on Tuesday, Dec. 6th. This is to get ourselves ready for Christmas. True celebration of Christmas is to celebrate it in the state of grace. Through confession life of grace is restored in our life. Let us make great use of this opportunitv.
