

Jesus Christ is our King

Today is the last Sunday of the liturgical year and the feast of Christ the King. Jesus Christ is the King of the universe. He reigns in heaven, on earth and under the earth. He is the Alpha and the Omega, the beginning and the end. He is our king. The first reading (2Samuel 5:1-3) talks about the kingship of David. David was the best king of Israel. David's kingship pointed to the kingship of Christ. Prophet Isaiah talking about the future messiah said "He will sit on David's kingly throne to give it lasting foundation of justice and right."(Is. 9:7). Angel Gabriel announcing to Mary about her incoming Son said "..... The Lord God will give him the throne of his ancestor David and he shall reign over the house of Jacob eternally" (Luke 1:32 -33). David's kingship laid foundation to the kingship of Christ.

The Psalmist of today said "I rejoice when I heard them said let us go to the house of God."(Ps 122:1-5). The Church of God is the kingdom of God on earth. We are members of this kingdom. We are God's children. Jesus is our King. Let us always allow Jesus to reign in our hearts, families and societies. His kingdom is the kingdom of justice and truth, holiness, love and peace. When we practice these virtues, Jesus is truly reigning in our lives. Jesus became king through suffering. Today's gospel (Luke 23:35-43) tells us how he died on the cross for us. He is a humble king. He is a king who came to serve and not to be served, a king who laid down his life for his people. Jesus died on the cross for us.

Christians today are reminded that leadership is all about sacrificing for the good of others. Jesus sacrificed his life for our salvation. We are all called upon to live for the good and welfare of others. We are called to wash the feet of others as Jesus washed the feet of his apostles. He is the King, yet he humbled himself to serve us. He teaches us that greatness lies in humble service to God and humanity. Let us all imitate him.

We are also invited today to renew our loyalty to Christ, to reassure him of our love and obedience. Jesus said that the sheep that belongs to him listen to his voice and follow him (cf. John 10:27). Let us constantly listen to the voice of our king and shepherd calling us through the church, through the scriptures and through our consciences. Obedience

to his voice makes us authentic members of his kingdom on earth. When we serve him well in his kingdom here on earth, we shall be admitted into his kingdom in heaven at the close of our earthly

We pray with the repentant thief on the cross, "Jesus remember me when you come into your kingdom."
