Joyful Expectation as the Coming of Jesus is Near.

The third Sunday of advent is called Gaudete Sunday. Gaudete is a Latin word meaning "Rejoice." The church today invites us today to rejoice for the coming of the Lord is nearby. Christmas is a couple of days away. Jesus brings joy, happiness, peace, and love. As Christians we should be happy always. In Phil.4:4-5 St. Paul said "Rejoice always. I say it again: Rejoice! ... the Lord is coming soon."

The reason why we exchange Christmas cards and gifts is to share the joy and love of Jesus with one another. The reason why we visit friends and family members, or they visit us at Christmas is to share the joy and goodness of Jesus. Look at what Isaiah said in the first reading (Is.35:1-6,10) "Your God comes to save you.... those whom the Lord has ransomed will return to Zion singing, crowned with everlasting joy; they will meet with joy and gladness, sorrow and mourning will flee." These words of the prophet mean that in the presence of Jesus there will be blessings and favors. If we truly accept Jesus in our hearts, sorrow, guilt feelings, painful memories will disappear. In John 10: 10 Jesus said, "....I came that you may have life and have it abundantly." Abundant life Jesus talks about is not only spiritual. It also includes life free from depression, unnecessary anxiety, fear, from negative thoughts. It means a life of peace, joy, gladness, good mental and emotional health.

Jesus is however not saying that all our human problems will disappear. In so far as we are in the world there must be problems but amid these problems, we should be joyful because Jesus is with us. In John 16:33 Jesus told us 'In the world you have tribulation and distress and trials/suffering, but be courageous, (be of good cheers, be filled with joy), for I have overcome the world. Nehemiah 8:10 says "The joy of the Lord is my strength".

Sometimes we may feel that God has abandoned us or allowed us to be passing through very difficult times. In whatever situation we are, Jesus Christ is with us and thus we should be happy. See what happened in today's gospel (Matt. 11:2-11): John the Baptist in prison was hearing about the miracles of Jesus. In his mind John the Baptist could be thinking: I prepared the way for this man, I baptized him in River Jordan, I was a very good friend of his, then why can't he miraculously deliver me from the hand

of Herod who put me in this prison; why can't he set me free from this prison? This was why John began to doubt whether this was the true Christ. Thus, he sent his disciples to go and ask Christ "Are you the one who is to come, or should we look for another? John the Baptist acted humanly like the rest of us would have acted.

But Jesus loved John the Baptist so much and he has very high regard for him. Look at the beautiful things he said about John in today's gospel. He praised John for being so good. Yet he kept quiet when John was languishing in prison. Jesus as God has his reason for allowing John to pass through such painful experience. He never abandoned him. Such can be applicable with us. Jesus is with us in our difficult situations. He can never abandon us. He loves us. Thus. Joy and peace should fill our hearts always instead of sorrow and pain. (Song: It is well with my soul)
