JESUS IS THE REASON FOR OUR JOY

Today, third Sunday of advent is called Gaudete Sunday. That means Sunday of joy. Gaudete is a Latin word for "rejoice." The church invites us to rejoice for the Lord is nearby. Jesus is our joy and our hope. Without him life is useless. Without him there is no hope for humanity. Isaiah in the first reading (Is.61:1-2,10-11) with joy prophesied his coming. He is coming to heal the broken hearted, to liberate the captives, to comfort the sorrowful, to strengthen the weak and bring good tidings of joy to the poor and the afflicted. The responsorial psalm (Luke1:46-54) of today is the song of joy of our blessed mother, Mary-the Magnificat. She sang: 'My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord; my spirit rejoices in God my Saviour.' St. Paul in the second reading (1Thess 5:16-24) repeats the same words of joy. He said: "brothers and sisters rejoice always. Pray without ceasing..." John the Baptist in today's gospel (John1:6-8,19-28) with joy testified that Christ is the light of the world. John came to prepare the way for Christ, and he presented him when he came.

The church teaches us today that our joy should be rooted in the person of Jesus Christ and in good relationship with him. Our Joy should not be dependent on the circumstances of our lives because these circumstances can change but God does not change. St. Paul said in today's second reading "In all circumstances give thanks..." that means in all circumstances whether good or bad let your inner joy and peace remain unaffected. Always be happy that Jesus is your friend, and he cares most for you. In Nehemiah 8:10 the scriptures say, "The joy of the Lord is our strength." This means that we are sustained by knowing that God is with us. There are expiring dates for human problems but "God's faithfulness, his mercy and love for us never cease; they are fresh every morning" (Lamentation 3:22-23). The joy that comes from the Lord endures and outlasts our ugly life circumstances.

The church also reminds us that God has anointed us as Christians to continue the mission of Christ: to be a comfort to the afflicted and the sorrowful, the lonely, the broken-hearted, those imprisoned by physical illness and those in various psychosocial and spiritual needs. We are to bring good tidings of joy to these people as Jesus did. We are messengers of joy.
