RECOGNIZING JESUS IN OUR DAILY LIFE

Today's gospel (Luke 24:13-35) presents to us three ways in which we can recognize Jesus in our everyday life.

In our fellow human beings: Two disciples were going to Emmaus. The risen Jesus came and joined them, but they never recognized him. They looked at him as a lonely traveler, a confused and ignorant person who was not informed about the happenings in society. They equally saw him as a stranger who needed assistance. That was why when they reached where they were going Jesus wanted to go on his way, they invited him to come and stay with them since it was getting late in the night. Do we recognize Jesus in our fellow human beings—the poor, the sick, the ignorant, the needy, the strangers.

In the Word of God: When Jesus was walking with the two disciples, he explained to them the scriptures, beginning with Moses and all the prophets. The two disciples unfortunately did not equally recognize him even though they acknowledged that they were touched at heart when he was speaking to them. Jesus speaks to us when we read the bible, or when we listen to the word of God. Form the habit of reading the bible and other spiritual books. God speaks to us through them. When you attend the Mass on the weekends or daily Masses listen attentively to the readings and to the homily; it is God speaking to us.

In the Holy Eucharist: The two disciples recognized Jesus in the breaking of the bread. When Jesus was at table with them, he took the bread and broke it and gave to them, and their eyes were opened. They recognized he was the one. This very strongly teaches us that Jesus is present in the Holy Eucharist. It is very unfortunate that many Catholics don't recognize Jesus in the Holy Eucharist. In a pew survey carried out in August 2019, it was discovered that only 1/3 of the American Catholics believe in the real presence of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. This is the reason why the American Bishops decided to organize a three- year Eucharistic revival program. This is to promote faith in the Eucharist. Jesus is fully present, Body, Soul, and Divinity, in the Holy Eucharist. In the gospel of John Chapter 6 Jesus

gave an extensive teaching on the Holy Eucharist. He said that unless we eat his Body and drink his Blood, we will not have eternal life; and that his Body is real food, and his Blood is real drink. Catholics are encouraged to believe strongly in the presence of Jesus in the Holy Eucharist. The Holy Eucharist is the source and summit of our Christian life.
