Love of God and Neighbour

Jesus said in today's gospel that the first and the greatest of all the commandments is to love God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind and with all your strength. The second is to love your neighbour as yourself (Mark 12:28-34). This means that if we sincerely love God and our neighbours, we will surely inherit God's kingdom. All the commandments are summarized in love of God and love of neighbour. The Psalmist in today's responsorial psalm said: "I love you Lord my strength" (Ps. 18). This Psalmist openly professed his love for God.

Do you love God? This question needs personal answer. To answer the question correctly we consider the following signs of love of God:

*Interest in things of God: Ps. 122:1 says, "I rejoice when I heard them say, let us go to God's house." People who love God are happy doing God's work; responding to church invitations, attending church activities; attending masses. Things of God give them joy.

*Keeping God's commandments: In John 14:15, Jesus said, "if you love me keep my commandments" Obeying God's instructions is a sign of having love and respect for God. A child who loves his father will always obey his instructions.

*Love of Prayer: Prayer is communication with God, talking to God. It is natural that one talks frequently with somebody whom he loves. If you don't like talking to God, that is, if you don't like praying, it is a sign that you don't have much love for God. Morning prayers, night prayers, weekend masses, daily masses, Eucharistic adoration, and other forms of prayers are all signs of love of God.

*Holiness of life: 1Peter 1:15-16 says: "As he who called you is holy, be holy in all your conduct." When we make effort to live holy life, we are manifesting love for God because God himself is holy and he seriously wants us to be holy.

Love of neighbour: Today's first reading (Exodus22:20-26) lays emphasis on the love of neighbour. Loving your neighbour means having good and caring attitude towards our fellow human beings. It means being merciful and kind to others. Loving your neighbour equally means keeping to the Golden Rule (Matt.7:12) which says, "Treat others as you would want them to treat you."

Note that love of God and love of neighbour always go together. Love is vertical and horizontal. You cannot truly love God without loving your neighbour and you cannot truly love your neighbour without loving God. Let us ask the Holy Spirit to deepen in our hearts love for God and for our neighbours.
