HUMILITY AND SERVICE

Last Thursday was November 2nd, the feast of All Souls, the day we remember the dead. We had Mass at the cemetery. We prayed for the dead, and we also reminded ourselves that we all shall end up at the cemetery. When we remember that we shall die one day, that should make us to be humble.

Jesus in today's gospel (Matthew 23:1-12) talks about humility and service. He said "The greatest among you must be your servant. Whoever exalts himself will be humbled; but whoever humbles himself will be exalted." Jesus gave this teaching on humility and service because of the attitudes of the pharisees and scribes who were the political and religious leaders of the people at that time. Out of arrogance, pride, and self-deceit, they do not practice what they preach, and they would like to be served rather than serving others. They were living hypocritical lives. They say one thing and do another. That was why Jesus was not happy with them and thus advised the people not to emulate their actions.

Jesus proposed servant-leadership model, that is, leadership by service and example. And that was what he, Jesus represents. Jesus said, "I came to serve and not to be served and to give my life as a ransom for many...." (Mark 10:45). In Matthew 11:29 he said, "Learn from me for I am humble and gentle of heart." Jesus had the humility of a leader. He led by example. His words and actions go together. That was why he asked us to imitate him and not to imitate the pharisees and scribes.

Leaders are called to be humble servants of others. Among us here are political leaders, religious leaders, community leaders, school leaders, family leaders, leaders in various work areas. We have people in various positions of authority. Whatever position we find ourselves in, let's always remember that we are called to serve. Whatever we have on earth let's always remember that those things came from God and should be used in humility to serve others. Like Jesus let our words and actions go together. Let us serve others with the example of our lives. Actions speak louder than

words. Pope Paul V1 said "Modern man listens more willingly to witnesses than to teachers, and if he does listen to teachers, it is because they are witnesses." That means that witness of life speaks volumes.
