In our life on earth, we pass through a lot of hardship, stress, and sufferings as human beings and as Christians. Let us see these life's trials as the stress of climbing Mount Tabor. When we persevere in faithfulness and reach the top of the mountain, we shall see the glory of Christ; we shall enjoy the beatific vision.

This is the hope that sustains us in our life's pilgrimage. May we continue to listen to Jesus the beloved Son of God and to his church.
