

In anticipation of some possible grant funding, could you please advise Father Cally of any flood damages you may have incurred as a result of the flooding the end of June.



#### THE CROSS IS OUR IDENTITY

Jesus said to his disciples in today's gospel Matt.16:21-27) "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross and follow me..." This implies that whoever wants salvation must be ready to suffer for it. Nothing good comes easy. No cross-no salvation; no death-no resurrection; no suffering-no glory; no Good Friday-no Easter Sunday. Cross is like a shadow that goes with each of us. We cannot avoid it in life. Jesus gained salvation for us through his suffering and death on the cross. Satan doesn't want the way of the cross. That is why he tried through Peter to stop Jesus from suffering and dying. Satan doesn't want our salvation. Thus, Jesus responded to Peter in today's gospel, "Get behind me Satan." Jesus doesn't mean that Peter himself is Satan, but his action is satanic. Any action against the will of God is satanic. It is God's will that his Son, Jesus should save us through the cross. Peter wanted to oppose this intention of God. That's why Jesus pushed him out of his way calling him Satan.

The cross is never sweet. It is always bitter, but it is a way to success. It is the gateway to heaven. Everybody has his/her own cross to carry. Crosses have to do with the challenges of life, pains, and sufferings we encounter on our journey of life. Crosses come to us regularly. Carry your own and keep on following Jesus. Jesus said that we must take up our cross and follow him. Here lies the difference between the suffering of a Christian and the suffering of those who don't know Christ. Christian suffering is a redemptive suffering. The crosses we carry as Christians are united with the cross of Jesus Christ.

Like prophet Jeremiah in the first reading (Jeremiah 20:7-9), may we stand firm despite the trials and continue to do God's will. St. Paul in the second reading (Rom. 12:1-2) encouraged us never to allow the corrupt world to influence us but to always live holy lives pleasing to God. This advice goes in line with the question Jesus asked in today's gospel: what profit will there be for one to gain the whole world and forfeit his soul? Or what can one give in exchange for his soul?
