#### **EPILEPSY WARNING**





## **Identifying Parts**




#### **Precautions**

- When the AC Adaptor is not in use, unplug it from the electrical outlet.
- Do not leave the System or any of its parts in direct sunlight, in damp areas or near a heater.
- Use only the Genesis AC Adaptor supplied with this system. Using a different AC Adaptor will damage your System and void the warranty.
- Do not disassemble the Console or any of its parts.


## **Connecting the Sega Genesis**

#### Hooking Up the Sega Genesis System Is Simple!



#### **Connections to TV/Monitor and Antenna**

There are various types of TV sets and antenna terminals. You may need to use all or some of the three following types of connectors:




- RF Unit (included)
- F-type Converter (300/75 ohm) (not included)
- Matching Transformer (75/300 ohm) (not included)

Compare your TV to the illustrations on the next few pages to decide which procedure is necessary.

## If your TV does not have Video and Audio Inputs, use one of the following procedures:


## TV with single-plug Antenna Cable (for either Cable TV or VHF Antenna Cable)



If a single-plug Antenna Cable is plugged into your TV (or if you have Cable TV), use the RF Unit. No other connectors are necessary.

- 1 Unplug the Antenna Cable from the TV, and plug it into the RF Unit.
- Now, plug the RF Unit Antenna Cable into the TV.
- Finally, plug the RF Cable into the A/V OUT Jack on the back of the Genesis Console.


#### **TV with F-type Converter**



If an F-type Converter is plugged into your TV, use the RF Unit. No other connectors are necessary.

- Find the F-type Converter that's connected to the antenna and plugged into the TV. Unplug it from the TV, and plug it into the RF Unit.
- Now, plug the RF Unit Antenna Cable into the TV.
- Finally, plug the RF Cable into the A/V OUT Jack on the back of the Genesis Console.


## TV with an Antenna Cable consisting of a Twin-Lead Antenna wire



If the Antenna Cable consists of a Twin-Lead Antenna wire connected to your TV, you'll need a Matching Transformer and an F-type Converter (both available from electronics stores) and the RF Unit (included).

- Disconnect the Twin-Lead Antenna wire from the TV, and connect it to the F-type Converter.
- Plug the F-type Converter into the RF Unit.
- Plug the RF Unit Antenna Cable into the Matching Transformer. Connect the Transformer's Twin-Lead Antenna wire to the back of the TV.
- Finally, plug the RF Cable into the A/V OUT Jack on the back of the Genesis Console.


## TV with Cable TV or VHF Antenna Cable plugged into Matching Transformer



If Cable TV or a VHF Antenna Cable is already plugged into a Matching Transformer on the back of your TV, use the RF Unit with your Matching Transformer.

- Leave the Twin-Lead Antenna wire of the Matching Transformer connected to the TV. Unplug the VHF Antenna Cable from the other end of the Transformer.
- Plug the VHF Antenna Cable into the RF Unit.
- Plug the RF Unit Antenna Cable into the Matching Transformer.
- Finally, plug the RF Cable into the A/V OUT Jack on the back of the Genesis Console.

#### TV with connected Video Cassette Recorder (VCR)




If a Video Cassette Recorder (VCR) is already connected between the antenna and the television's VHF terminals, use the RF Unit (and, if necessary, an F-type Converter and/or a Matching Transformer — both available from electronics stores).

- Disconnect the VCR Cable from the television's VHF terminal (or from its Matching Transformer). Then, plug this cable into the RF Unit. (If this cable has a Twin-Lead Antenna wire, use an F-type Converter to make this connection.)
- Plug the RF Unit Antenna Cable into the television's VHF terminal. (If a Twin-Lead Antenna wire is required, use a Matching Transformer to make this connection.)
- Finally, plug the RF Cable into the A/V OUT Jack on the back of the Genesis Console.

### **Optional Hookups**

If your TV has video and audio inputs, use one of the following procedures:

TV with Video and Mono Audio Input Jacks, (or VCR, if TV is connected to VCR)




If your TV has Video and Mono Audio Input Jacks (usually on the back of recent models), you can use the *optional* **Sega Audio/Video Cable** for improved graphics and sound. No other connectors are necessary.

If your TV is connected to your VCR, it is also possible to achieve improved graphics and sound by using the *optional* **Sega Audio/Video Cable** with your VCR.

To order the **Sega Audio/Video Cable**, see the enclosed Parts Order Form and call 1-800-USA-SEGA, or contact your local retailer.

- Insert the single-plug end of the **Audio/Video Cable** into the A/V OUT Jack on the Genesis Console.
- Insert the yellow plug on the **Audio/Video Cable** into the composite TV or monitor's Video Input Jack (or into the VCR Video Input Jack). Insert the white plug into the TV or monitor's Audio Input Jack (or into the VCR Audio Input Jack).
- Lastly, select the Audio/Video Input setting on your TV (or VCR), when playing the Genesis.

#### TV with Video and Stereo Audio Input Jacks (Stereo TV), or TV connected to Stereo VCR




If your TV has Video and Stereo Audio Input Jacks (Stereo TV) or is connected to a Stereo VCR, you can use the *optional* **Sega Stereo Audio/Video Cable** for improved graphics and stereo sound. No other connectors are necessary.

To order the **Sega Stereo Audio/Video Cable**, see the enclosed Parts Order Form and call 1-800-USA-SEGA, or contact your local retailer.

- Insert the single-plug end of the **Stereo Audio/Video Cable** into the A/V OUT Jack on the Genesis Console.
- Insert the yellow plug on the **Stereo Audio/Video Cable** into the composite TV or monitor's Video Input Jack (or into the VCR Video Input Jack). Insert the white plug into the left Audio Input Jack, and the red plug into the right Audio Input Jack of the TV or monitor (or VCR).
- Lastly, select the Audio/Video Input setting on your TV (or VCR) when playing the Genesis.

#### Stereo Sound for TV without Stereo Audio Input Jacks through a Home Stereo or Stereo VCR



If you have a mono audio TV, you can still enjoy stereo sound from your Genesis through your home stereo system or stereo VCR. Use the *optional* **Sega Stereo Audio/Video Cable** for improved graphics and stereo sound. No other connectors are necessary.


To order the **Sega Stereo Audio/Video Cable**, see the enclosed Parts Order Form and call 1-800-USA-SEGA, or contact your local retailer.

- Insert the single-plug end of the **Stereo Audio/Video Cable** into the A/V OUT jack on the Genesis Console.
- Insert the yellow plug on the **Stereo Audio/Video Cable** into the composite TV or monitor's Video Input Jack (or into the VCR Video Input Jack if the VCR is connected to the stereo, and the TV is connected to the VCR).
- Insert the red cable plug into the right Audio Input Jack, and the white plug into the left Audio Input Jack of your stereo (or VCR). If your stereo is not located very close to your TV, you may need an *optional* Female to Male RCA Extension Cable.

**Note:** *Always* have the volume control turned all the way down when you first turn on the Genesis System.



## **Powering Up the System**




- ☐ Connect the AC Adaptor Plug to the Adaptor Jack on the back of the Genesis Console.
- ☐ Plug the AC Adaptor into an electrical outlet.

### **TV Channel Setting**



- If you are using the RF Unit, set the Channel Switch on the RF Unit to CH 3. If you are not using the RF Unit, go to page 15.
- 2 Set your TV to channel 3.
- If channel 3 is used for TV viewing, set your TV to channel 4. Then, switch the Channel Switch on the RF Unit to CH 4.
- If your TV has an automatic fine-tuning control (AFC), turn it off and manually adjust the picture. However, if you have a color TV that turns black and white when the AFC is turned off, leave the AFC on.


## **Operating the System**




- Plug a Genesis Control Pad into Control Port 1 on the Console. For two players, plug a second Genesis Control Pad (optional) into Control Port 2.
- Turn the Power Button off. Check it by making sure the Power-On Indicator light is not on.
- Insert a Cartridge, with the label facing forward, into the Cartridge Slot. Press it *FIRMLY* into the Slot until the Cartridge "locks" into place. (If you turn the Console over, the Cartridge should remain in place.)
- Turn the power on. The Power-On Indicator light should come on.
- If all connections have been made properly, the Sega logo will appear, followed by the game's title screen. In some cases, a demonstration game will then begin (see the game's instruction manual).

## Connecting this Genesis to a Sega-CD

**Note:** If your SEGA-CD looks like this, refer to your SEGA-CD Owner's Manual for details on how to connect it to your Genesis.





If your SEGA-CD looks like this, use these instructions to connect your Genesis and SEGA-CD.





Use the steel joining plate supplied with the original SEGA-CD to connect the Genesis to the SEGA-CD. Follow the procedure below to attach the steel joining plate to the Genesis. You'll need to use a standard screwdriver and a Phillips-head screwdriver when attaching the steel joining plate.

- For details on the functions and operation of the SEGA-CD, please refer to the SEGA-CD Owner's Manual.
- Make sure your Genesis system is set up and operating properly.
- Turn off the power button of the Genesis, and remove its AC adaptor from the power outlet. (If the SEGA-CD AC Adaptor is also plugged in, remove it from the power outlet.)











- Remove the cover of the expansion slot panel, located on the bottom of the Genesis. Remove the red plastic cover from the expansion slot connector (ignore the labelled message "Do Not Remove"). Store both covers in a safe place. (See illustration 3.)
- Position the steel joining plate on the bottom of the Genesis, over the small connector plate. Secure the steel joining plate with the supplied screw.


  (See illustration 4.)
- Slide the Genesis onto the SEGA-CD. Make sure the connector in the Genesis expansion slot fits snugly into the connector terminal on the SEGA-CD. (See illustration 5.)
- Make sure the Genesis power button is turned off. Then plug in its AC adaptor. (See illustration 6.)


**Note:** Always lift the Genesis and the SEGA-CD together by holding onto the sides of the SEGA-CD.




**Note:** Do not switch the AC adaptors. Use the Genesis AC Adaptor **only** with the Genesis, and the SEGA-CD AC Adaptor **only** with the SEGA-CD.









#### **Stereo Sound**

- For Stereo TV/Stereo VCR use the **Sega Stereo Audio Video Cable**. See page 12.
- For Non-stereo TV use the **Sega Stereo Audio/Video Cable** and Female to Male RCA Extension Cable (see page 13) *or* the **Sega Audio/Video Cable** and Standard 2-pin RCA Cable (see page 8 of the *Sega-CD Owner's Manual*, CONNECTING A STEREO TV).

## **Troubleshooting Chart**

Screen flickers or no color.	Are the Antenna Cables connected properly?
	Are the TV channel fine adjustments set properly?
	Are the TV color controls set properly?
	Is the Genesis Cartridge inserted properly?
No game sound.	Is the TV volume too low, or off?
	<ul> <li>Have the connection cables come loose, or gotten disconnected?</li> </ul>
Picture on TV screen is unsteady.	Adjust the vertical and horizontal hold controls on the TV.
Fringes appear on TV during a game.	Adjust the manual fine-tuning adjustment controls on the TV.
Fringes appear on TV during a broadcast.	Is the Antenna Cable connected properly?
	Make sure that you have turned off the Power Switch on the Genesis Console.
No Power Light.	Is there power to the wall socket?

If you continue to have a problem, use this manual to carefully re-connect the system, step by step. If the problem still exists, please call the Sega Consumer Service Department, toll free, at **1-800-USA-SEGA**.

#### **Limited Warranty**

Sega of America, Inc. warrants to the original consumer purchaser that the Sega Genesis System and all component parts shall be free from defects in material and workmanship for a period of 90 days from the date of purchase. If a defect covered by this limited warranty occurs during the 90-day limited warranty period, Sega will repair or replace the defective system or component part, at its option, free of charge.

This limited warranty does not apply if the defects have been caused by negligence, accident, unreasonable use, modifications, tampering, or any other causes not related to defective materials or workmanship. Additionally, this warranty shall not be valid if the serial number of the Genesis unit has been altered, defaced or removed in any way.

Please retain your dated sales receipt to easily establish the date of purchase for in-warranty repairs.

#### Repairs after Expiration of Limited Warranty

If your Sega Genesis System requires repairs after termination of the 90-day limited warranty period, you may contact the Sega Consumer Service Department at the number listed above. If the technician is unable to solve the problem by phone, he or she will advise you of the estimated cost of repair. If you elect to have the repair done, you will need to return the defective merchandise, freight prepaid and insured against loss or damage, to Sega's Service Center with an enclosed check or money order payable to Sega of America, Inc. for the amount of the cost estimate provided to you by the technician. If, after inspection, it is determined that your system cannot be repaired, it will be returned to you and your payment will be refunded.

#### **Limitations on Warranty**

Any applicable implied warranties, including warran-

ties of merchantability and fitness for a particular purpose, are hereby limited to 90 days from the date of purchase and are subject to the conditions set forth herein. In no event shall Sega of America, Inc. be liable for consequential or incidental damages resulting from the breach of any express or implied warranties.

The provisions of this limited warranty are valid in the United States only. Some states do not allow limitations on how long an implied warranty lasts or exclusion of consequential or incidental damages, so the above limitation or exclusion may not apply to you. This limited warranty provides you with specific legal rights. You may have other rights which vary from state to state.
