SAFETY STARTS AT HOME:

Always lock your doors and windows

Be careful of hiding keys outside your home

Exterior lights are helpful in deterring potential attacks,

Have motion lights high out of reach

Use light times to turn lights off an don throughout day and night

Never answer door without knowing who it is

Get alarm system—make sign visible to everyone

Get cameras on outside and INSIDE of home

Keep entrance to residence clear of clutter, no hiding places

NEIGHBORHOOD WATCH PROGRAM—5 EASY STEPS

Recruit and organize as many neighbors as possible

Contact your local law enforcement agency and schedule a meeting

Discuss community concerns and develop an action plan

Create a communication plan (FB, Twitter, contact numbers)

Take action: Hold meetings and events

SAFETY ON THE ROAD

Keep can of fix a flat in each vehicle

Keep first aid kit

When out and about, make sure someone knows where you are and when you will be back

CONTACT POLICE FOR CONTROL AND DIRECT PATROL

Put houses on watch list

Speeding, suspicious persons, suspicious activity

Let police know vital information and create Cad card

Cad cards have important info on residence

Special needs, gate codes,

emergency response/Medical,

who has permission to be there,

phone numbers for owners and care takers

BECOME YOUR OWN DETECTIVE: Police need your help—You are the expert on you, your home, your street and your neighborhood— Do the leg work yourself—Take pictures—Keep an observation Journal.
