Restoration is Closer Than it Appears

Genesis 22:1-19 (NKJV)

Verse 1:

"Now it came to pass after these things that God tested Abraham, and said to him, 'Abraham!' And he said, 'Here I am.'"

Exodus 14 (NKJV)

Reflection:

Thus Israel saw the great work which the Lord had done in Egypt; so the people feared the Lord, and believed the Lord and His servant Moses."

Reflection:

Deuteronomy 28:1-14 (NKJV)

Verse 15-16: "Reaffirming the Promise"

"Then the Angel of the Lord called to Abraham a second time out of heaven, and said: 'By Myself, I have sworn, says the Lord, because you have done this thing, and have not withheld your son, your only son,'"

Decree:

I decree that God's promises are reaffirmed in my acts of faith. As I demonstrate my trust in Him, He responds with greater assurances of His plans for my restoration.

Verse 17: "Blessings Multiplied"

Decrees for Exodus 14

Verse 1-2: "Divine Direction"

"Now the Lord spoke to Moses, saying: 'Speak to the children of Israel, that they turn and camp before Pi Hahiroth, between Migdol and the sea, opposite Baal Zephon; you shall camp before it by the sea.'"

Decree:

I decree that I will trust in God's divine direction, even when the path seems uncertain or challenging. His plans always have a purpose, and trusting His guidance leads to miraculous deliverance and restoration.

Verse 3-4: "God's Glory Revealed"

"For Pharaoh will say of the children of Israel, 'They are bewildered by the land; the wilderness has closed them in.' Decree:

Not so much as one of them remained."

Decree:

Verse 29-31: "Faith Strengthened"

"But the children of Israel had walked on dry land in the midst of the sea, and the waters were a wall to them on their right hand and on their left. Thus Israel saw the great work which the Lord had done in Egypt; so the people feared the Lord, and believed the Lord and His servant Moses."

Decree:
