After judging each component, place a check in the appropriate column; blue, red, white. If the article does not have the component listed, leave the column blank. Provide comments whenever a check is placed in the red or white category. After judging is complete, assign a ribbon placing.

STANDARDS TO CONSIDER WHEN SCORING

OVERALL APPEARANCE Clean, neat, ready to use or wear.

HARMONY OF PATTERN, Pattern, yarn/thread, trim, and fasteners suited to the design. Pattern YARN/THREAD, & TRIM

stitch/design enhances structural lines of item, correct size needle or

hook used with yarn to create pattern stitch.

Colors harmonize; same dye lot used. **COLOR COORDINATION**

CARE INSTRUCTIONS Correct and complete care information given. Instructions are written

and included with garment or item if a care label is not sewn in. If label is

sewn in, it is easy to find and comfortable to wear.

PROPERLY BLOCKED Blocked uniformly, properly shaped, smooth, flat, texture of yarn/thread

retained. Blocking enhances detail of design.

TENSION UNIFORM Even, smooth appearance. Knitting: cast-on stitches/bound-off stitches.

Crochet: chain, ring, ending stitches-even, smooth, flexible. Correct elas-

ticity for item.

KNITTING/CROCHET

STITCHES

Even, uniform. No split varns, no holes, no dropped or twisted stitches.

Increase/decrease neat and smooth.

YARN/THREAD ENDS

INCONSPICUOUS

Joined or woven securely, inconspicuously. Ends worked in. No loose

varn ends, no obvious knots.

CARRIED YARNS Neat, smooth, and not too tight.

SEAM FINISH Smooth, flat, secure, free from puckers, free from bulk. Corresponding

sections match at seams. Stretch allowed where needed. Seams rein-

forced where needed to prevent stretching.

HAND/MACHINE STITCHING Even tension, even stitch length, smooth, flexible but firm.

RIBBING Even, correct elasticity for item.

Smooth, neat, straight, flat. **EDGES**

FASTENERS Appropriate for the garment, design, and yarn/thread. Buttonholes are

reinforced to hold shape, evenly spaced, same size, and properly placed

and securely attached.

Applied securely and evenly, uniform in size. TRIMS, TASSELS, POMPONS

SLEEVES, ARMHOLES Smooth, free from bulk.

OTHER DETAILS-POCKETS,

COLLARS, TIES, ETC.

Neat, smooth, functional. Left and right sides even, if designed to be.

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
