

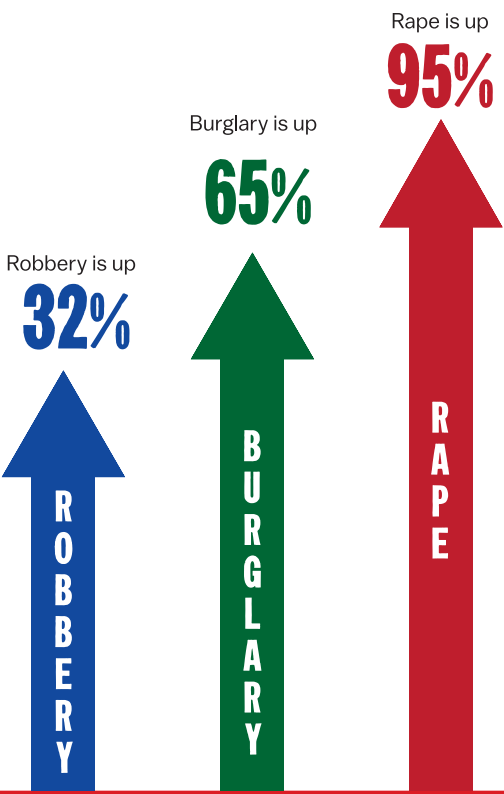
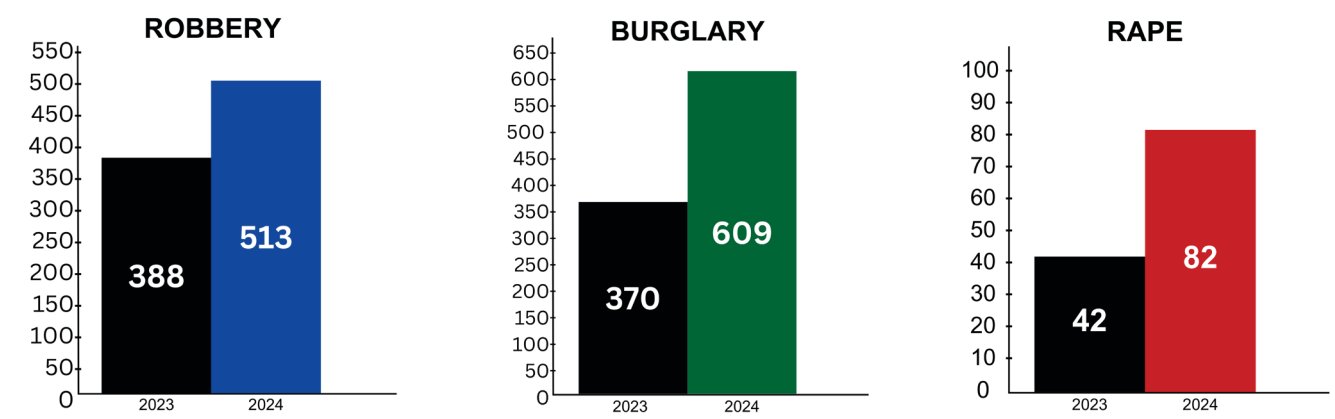

2023-2024 Jersey City Crime

Between 2023 and 2024, the number of reported offenses of rape increased by 95%, burglary increased by 65%, and robbery increased by 32% in Jersey City (OPRA).

Walking through my parents' neighborhoods in Greenville and Bergen-Lafayette, numerous families shared they feel unprotected and unsafe in their homes, streets, parks, and school yards. **The most basic responsibility of City Hall is to keep you, your family, your home, and your neighborhood safe and secure. 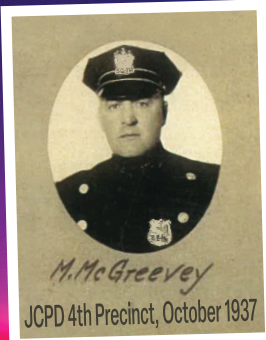

- Improve the **JCPD Juvenile Bureau** by staffing school resource officers to intervene with at-risk youths, decrease truancy and enhance learning.
- Update the **JCPD website** to be more interactive for residents, publish real-time neighborhood crime statistics, and make policies and procedures more accessible.

Achieve Vision Zero – Our Commitment to Eliminating Traffic Fatalities

- **JCPD Walking and Biking Units** to improve pedestrian safety.
- **Traffic Bureau** to enhance our Traffic Enforcement.
- **Trailer Inspection and Enforcement Unit** to correct improperly routed and parked trucks.
- **Automatic License Plate Readers** (ALPR) to alert officers of dangerous and stolen vehicles.
- **Motorcycle Squad** for enforcement in congested areas.
- **E-Bike Regulation** to mandate licensing and registration.
- **School Bus Safety Cameras** to penalize drivers who illegally pass school buses during drop-off and pick-up.
- Reinstitute **Residential and Business Parking Permits** and ensure enforcement.
