It is our responsibility as neighbors to work together to build the City in which we all deserve to live.

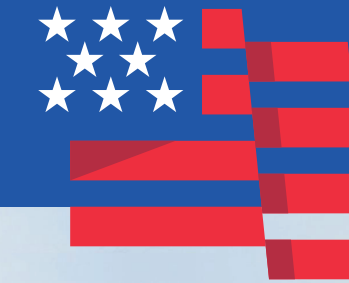
