FROM THE PASTOR"S DESK

REFORMATION AND HALLOWEEN?

What is so special about Oct. 31st? Most Americans would immediately respond: "It's Halloween!" This would conjure up visions of pumpkins, jack-o-lanterns, costumed children out trick or treating, and masquerade parties of one kind or another.

As Lutheran Christians, hopefully, we would respond to the above question in another way. We would identify this day as the date on which the Lutheran Reformation began. It was on this date that Dr. Martine Luther nailed 95 statements, or theses, for discussion to the church door at Wittenberg, Germany. This act was the beginning of a serious re-evaluation of the current church practices and doctrines

The term "reformation" simply refers to a "change to a former, normal condition." It was under the direction of Almighty God that Dr Luther began the great task of separating the Word of God from the teachings of men as practiced in the church of his day.

Today we enjoy the results of the work of the reformers (and there were many). We rejoice that we can stand confidently on the three "solas" that Luther and the reformation emphasize. We know that it is my grace alone (sola gratia) that we have become the children of God. It is by faith alone (sola fide) that the benefits of the plan of salvation come to each of us. It is by Scripture alone (sola Scriptura) that the Holy Spirit makes us aware of the great blessings which God has provided for us.

If not for the man, Dr. Martin Luther and many other reformers, the Church would not have had what we know today as "The Reformation." We need to remember the blessings which God has given to us beginning on Oct. 31st, 1517. The message of the reformation is still important and applicable in our lives and in the 21st century.

What you need:


- Shoebox with lid

- 2. As a family, decorate the box with drawings, favorite Bible verses, photos, or stickers.
- Place the box somewhere central, like the kitchen or living room.
- 4. Keep index cards and pens nearby. When someone has a prayer request, they can write or draw it and drop it in.
- 5. Throughout the week, take turns praying over the requests as a family, or have a parent lead prayer time.
