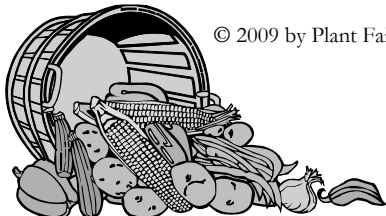


When to Plant Your Vegetables



These planting times, P.H., and soil temperatures are approximate and may change a little from one area to another. Please use this chart as a guide only. See reverse side for a list of Heirloom varieties.
