Speaker Bio: Delaware State News Executive Editor Andrew West is in his 29th year with the state capital daily.

He has led news operations for the Delaware State News since 1996. His "From the Editor" column appears in Sunday editions.

West first joined the Delaware State News as Sports Editor, then from 1993 to 1996, he held editor positions for Delaware State News sister publications in Sussex County.

West got his start in newspapers as a senior in high school, reporting on sports for The Daily Times in Salisbury, Md., in 1980.

After graduating from the University of Delaware in 1985, he worked for The (Wilmington) News Journal, USA Today, The Saratogian in Saratoga Springs, N.Y.; The Lansdale (Pa.) Reporter and The Reading (Pa.) Eagle-Times.

When he can trade the work shoes for no shoes, he spends his time on the beach building sandcastles for fun and sometimes competing in contests in Delaware and New Jersey. West has 10 consecutive top 10 finishes in the Rehoboth Beach contest and last year finished second in the Pro-Am Division at Wildwood Crest, New Jersey.

His other love is soccer, coaching youth teams for the past 18 years and for the past five years serving as head coach of the Lake Forest School District's middle school gir'ls team.

He will talk about the past, present and future of the Delaware State News. He also can talk about sandcastles during Q & A.
