

# Our Speaker



County Librarian, Assistant Director of Community Services Kent County Levy Court Apr 2009 - Present14 years 4 months Kent County, Delaware

Shortly after accepting the post of County Librarian, tackled the challenge of retro-fitting a new 10,200 SF library facility -- without raising taxes, floating a bond, or receiving any State construction funds. When the new library opened in July 2010, it had already received an architectural award for steel beam construction.

In addition to planning and directing all administration of Kent County's Library Division, enjoys grant-writing to secure support and funding for library goals (beyond traditional budgetary sources). Successfully wrote and administered Target, WSFS, Delaware Division of Libraries, Delaware Division of Arts, Delaware Arts & Humanities Foundation grants, and others.

First library in Kent County to offer free WiFi access, and after opening in new location the community library consistently ranked in the top ten highest-circulating libraries state-wide for four years. With support from the state library, operates a free weekly Job Center service. Other note-worthy programs include the annual Winter Carnival fund raiser, If All Kent County Read the Same Book, Authors & Audiences (a regional writers showcase), installation of Little Free Libraries throughout Kent County, and the bookmobile's summer family performance series: Arts in the Park.

Collaboration and partnerships are key to ongoing success. Serves as liaison between the County and other libraries and community organizations. Customer Service trainer for the State. Users have dubbed us, "The Friendly Library on the Highway."

Hillary is also a published author!

# Local Advocacy:

**Delaware Veterans Commission list of Legislative Items**: We continue to support all DVCA initiatives. A new list is normally published each January, but I STILL have not seen it this year so far. This was something that Ron Sarg did and without Ron, it does not seem to be getting done. I feel their pain, Ron left big shoes for them to fill—I know and appreciate that more than anyone!

**NEW attempt to organize veterans**. I told you I attended several meetings hosted by Dave Lawson to organize us. He put it well: "Veterans in Delaware have many boots on the ground. We have to figure out how to get all those boots pointing in the right direction!" Our group came up with the suggestion to create a Department of Veterans Affairs. Now, that cry has been taken up by many. A new group met in Millsboro and you can read about it on the attached PDF.

#### Our chapter supported two issues.

VICTORY! HB 26 passed! Here are the details.

<u>Our Chapter on an ongoing basis is watching the Delaware Veterans Home</u>. Much has been written, another negative article appeared in the Delaware State News detailing how the Eagles Law (the law that sets the ratio of nursing staff to resident) was allowed to stay at Covid Emergency numbers for the simple reason they cannot retain staff in the DVH.

The Secretary of State is quoted in the paper saying that the pay is too low. However, he is in charge and he has never, not one time, asked Leg Hall to increase pay, or never has he exercised his authority to use the top half of the pay sliding scale vs. the bottom. This last

sentence is based on what I was told by many, but I have not found anything official that backs it up.

I attended a Soldier Support Fundraiser (benefitting the Sergeants Club on base) and bid on and won lunch for four hosted by the Lt. Governor. Since then, she announced she will run for Governor. I plan to address the DVH with her, also the military pay 100 percent issue, also the Secretary of Veterans Affairs issue. I am taking Doug Hudson and the woman who started the petition about the DVH with me to lunch. Cross your fingers it goes well!

**DUES!** It's PAST that time of year again....We are holding our rate to \$15.00 Here is how you can pay on line from Treasurer Tom Smith. Paying Chapter Dues Online: Dover Chapter dues are \$15 per year for Regular Members and \$10 per year for Surviving Spouses. Chapter members have the option of paying their annual dues online with a credit or debit card.

Go to the MOAA website at <u>www.moaa.org</u>, log-in, click on "Chapters", under "FAST ACCESS->Chapter Members", click on "Pay dues online", drop down to "Join/Renew Your Local Chapter", then down to "Getting Started" and follow the prompts. (If you can't log-in, go to www.moaa.org, click on "About MOAA", click on "Councils and Chapters", and then follow the directions above.) You can pay for multiple years if you like, up to three years. You can also donate, up to \$500, to the Chapter Scholarship Fund through this system.

There are a few restrictions however. You cannot pay for chapter dinners with a credit card. (Cash or check only please.) You cannot pay your national MOAA dues through this program. (National MOAA has its own credit card payment system.) Surviving spouses may not use this system. After you pay your dues through this system, you will receive an e-mail confirmation from national MOAA, and another e-mail from the Chapter Treasurer.

Remember, this is only an option! If you prefer, you may pay your chapter dues by check through the mail (mail to: Dover MOAA, P. O. Box 122, Dover, DE 19903), or by cash or check at one of our chapter meetings. (For your information, non-members may use this same system to join the chapter.) Our Newsletter editor was asleep on the job again, and he lost the photos I took from when I went to DC in April. He finally found them! *He was lying on them*! Here they are:



































