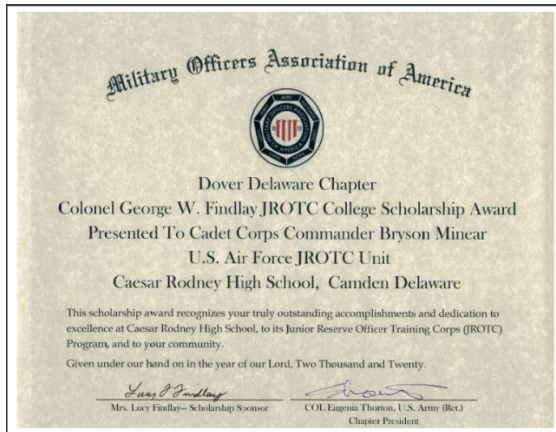
Update from JROTC Coordinator, John Jackson:

Congratulations to a Real Gem!

A native of Georgia and a graduate of the University of Georgia... a marine reservist for over 22 years... deployed twice to Iraq... serving most recently as a vital part of the joint forces Air Force Medical Examiner's System... owner and operator of Jewell Robinson Insurance and Financial Services... Jewell Robinson never expected to become involved in pageant life. After attending an event and meeting the reigning Ms. Delmarva Veteran, she became interested in the possibilities that such an adventure could offer. With no previous pageant experience, she jumped in with both feet, and at the end of September, was named "Ms. Delmarva Veteran!" "Making a positive difference" is exactly why Jewell chose to enter the Ms. Delmarva pageant world. Jewell wants to use her year-long reign to develop and implement a diversity and inclusion program in all branches of the armed services.

Currently, across all military branches, there is not a diversity and inclusion training or education program that is part of an annual required training.

She has engaged the offices of U.S. Congresswoman Lisa Blunt-Rochester, Governor John C. Carney and his Veteran Affairs Representative Joe Bryant – and, in the near future, she will be reaching out to key military officials. Her vision is to obtain approval to develop the program, create an elite team of individuals to help bring content to the program, teach the program to selected individuals who will, in turn, teach the concepts at each unit throughout all military branches, and who will continually be part of the evolution and transformation of the program for years to come.
