Disabled Bowling

Almost anyone, with or without a disability can play and participate in Indoor Bowls or Boccia.

Bowlers with a disability can compete with or against non-disabled bowlers in most situations.

Bowls at Newark Indoor is played in many formats, singles, pairs or triples.

If you have never tried bowls and have a disability, why not contact us, as you will be made to feel very welcome.

Parking	We currently have 3 disabled parking spaces available for club members and each are within 10 meters of the main entrance making access to the club easy.
Club Access	All access points, both external and internal, are wheelchair friendly making moving in and around the club easy and safe.
Internal	Access to the toilet area and changing rooms are easily accessible. Once inside the club there is no area that is not readily accessible by wheelchair.
Green Access	Access to the green for wheelchair users is available via the use of ramps and for non-wheelchair users there are handrails strategically placed at both ends of the green to assist when getting on and off the green.
Toilet Facilities	As well as the normal able bodied toilet there is also available a fully functional disabled toilet.
Equipment	In order for disabled participants to take part in bowls activities it may be necessary for individuals to purchase adaptive equipment. Should you feel that you would like to purchase additional equipment to help in your bowling enjoyment these are readily available through the club. However, as a club we already have some equipment: bowling launcher, bowling ramps, lifters, walking sticks plus a specially adapted wheelchair, so that you can get started straight away.
Boccia	Two Boccia courts are available for disabled and non-disabled participants. Boccia can be played either from a standing or sitting position. Anyone needing to use a wheelchair the Boccia rinks are easily accessible.
