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# MATH

## YOUR CHILD SHOULD KNOW HOW TO..

Represent fractions from 1/2-1/10

#### My child is struggling:

Have your child make fractions strips and order them from smallest to largest

#### My child is excelling:

Have your child practice adding fractions with same denominator (e.g. 4/10+2/10)

## Compose & decompose numbers up to 10,000

#### My child is struggling:

Have your child use the place value chart provided to put numbers into the correct spots Have your child spell large number (e.g. 11524 = eleven thousand five hundred twenty-four)

## Multiply & Divide from 1-10

#### My child is struggling:

See Appendix 5.3 for supporting

Break down multiplication questions into addition questions. Use physical 12 objects to help your child divide

### Calculate the price & change required for purchases

## YOUR CHILD SHOULD KNOW HOW TO ...

## Make text-self, text-text & text-world connections

#### My child is struggling:

Read a story with your child and make the connections first yourself. Then, have them orally share their own connections

#### My child is excelling:

Have your child read a story and write down 3 connections in paragraph form

## Read & comprehend novels

#### My child is struggling:

Have your child read out loud, to you. Ask them guestions about the story to ensure they understand the concepts. See Appendix 5.5

#### My child is excelling:

After every few chapters, have your child explain what happened in the text and what they think will happen next

### Write a letter

#### My child is struggling:




- Fifty-four thousand, nine hundred, twenty-eight

# 5.3 Multiplication and Division Activities

**Multiplication Activity:** Give your child a deck of cards (remove the Jacks, Queens, Kings and let them know Aces = 1). Your child will flip over two cards and multiply the two numbers together. They can then record the multiplication sentence and answer on a piece of paper.

**Division Activity:** Give your child 10–20 index cards. Have them write a division question on one card and the answer on another. After they are finished, they can sit with you and put the cards face down on the table. Take turns flipping over two cards. If the cards match, whoever flipped the cards keeps them. Take turns until there are no cards left. The player with the most pairs wins.

### Canned by Alex Shearer

Fergal collects grocery cans with no labels--but his mother says he must open one before he adds any more to his collection. Fergal finds some nasty surprises inside the cans and is determined to find out who is responsible.

### Indian No More by Charlene Willing McManis

Regina and her family are told that her tribe no longer exists and they are forced to move to Los Angeles. She moves away from the reservation that she's always known and has to begin a new life. This book is based on the repercussions of the 1957 Indian Relocation Act.

### Percy Jackson series by Rick Riordan

### George's Marvellous Medicine by Roald Dahl

Roald Dahl's classic tale about the lengths George will go to in order to deal with his horrible grandmother. George invents a medicine that might just cure everything.

### The Peculiar by Stefan Bachmann

Peculiars are secretive creatures who try desperately to remain invisible and unnoticed by ordinary people. A story that is full of magic and suspense.

### Extraordinary by Miriam Spitzer Franklin

Pansy is excited to see her best friend, Anna, at summer camp. In the year that has passed, Anna's world has changed completely. A story about friendship and disability

### Frindle by Andrew Clements

Nick decides to invent a new word and before he knows it all his friends start using the word, then the whole town, and pretty soon the new word is out of control!
