After the killing of Michael Brown in 2014 in Ferguson, the DOJ investigation uncovered the racial bias embedded in the Ferguson Police Department.

The intense focus on revenue generation created a pattern of unconstitutional police practices through the levying of fines and fees in municipal court.

Jennings, Normandy, Edmundson, and Maplewood has faced federal class-action lawsuits for their predatory practices and similar lawsuits are pending for Florissant and Ferguson.

### Fees and Fines

They violate civil rights of youth and adults when they don't comply with statutory requirements, public policy considerations, and Constitutional requirements

- 1. Causes more harm
  - a. escalating debt
  - b. revolving door of incarceration
  - c. extended parole/probation
  - d. immigration status changes

Disproportinately affects low-income communities and communities of color

 Juvenile delinquency


2. Juvenile delinquency cases can remain open.

# Constitutional Protections

#### **Eighth Amendment**

prohibits imposition
 of fines grossly
 disproportionate to
 the severity of the
 offense

#### **Fourteenth Amendment**

- 1. requires ability to pay determination
- consideration of alternatives
- 3. cannot create conflicts of interest
- 4. no intentional discrimination

# Constitutional Protections

Sixth and Fourteenth
Amendments require due
process protections:

- 1. Access to counsel
- 2. Notice
