Accessibility Policy



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1. Rationale

The Equality Act 2010 places a legal obligation on schools making it unlawful to discriminate against young people, staff and other stakeholders with a disability. This Act brings together several different equality laws including the Special educational Needs and Disability Act 2001 and the Disability Discrimination Act (DDA) 1995

We are committed to providing a fully accessible environment which values and includes all young people, staff, parents and carers, and visitors regardless of their education, physical, sensory, social, spiritual, emotional and cultural needs. As part of this provision all staff will challenge negative attitudes about disability and accessibility and work together to develop a culture of awareness, tolerance and inclusion.

2. Aims

The Accessibility Plan aims to ensure that we continue to work towards increasing the accessibility of provision for all young people, staff and visitors and it will contain actions to:

- Improve access to the physical environment of the school, adding specialist
 facilities as necessary. This covers improvements to the physical environment of
 premises and physical aids to access education, therapy and activities.
- Increase access to the curriculum for young people with a disability, expanding the
 curriculum as necessary to ensure that those with a disability are as equally, prepared
 for life as are the able-bodied young people. This covers teaching and learning and the
 wider curriculum offered at the school, such as participation in on site activities, leisure
 and cultural activities or visits. It also covers the provision of specialist aides and
 equipment, which may assist these young people in accessing the curriculum.
- Improve the delivery of information to young people, staff, parents and carers and
 visitors with disabilities. Examples might include handouts, timetables, textbooks and
 information about the school. The information should be made available in various
 preferred formats within a reasonable time frame.

3. Reviewing and Monitoring

The Accessibility Plan will be reviewed and monitored annually and the plan will be fully revised every three years
