Ron Bergeron asked us to attend a press meeting with Governor Ron DeSantis where they were going to announce new efforts to try and eradicate the Python. Bill Sirola put out a notice on the dialer and asked our members to attend. He also ask our members to wear their Red Club Shirts if they had one. Ten members showed up in club shirts and it was evident our BCAHCC was in attendance. Of the 50 people there, you could clearly see our club shirts. This is the third time I have attended these events. When I asked to speak to the Governor, they called on me, because our club was so well represented. I explained to the Governor, the 3,000 Pythons that have been caught, most have been taken on the levees. I said the Pythons are in the swamp and even the best trappers in Florida, can only penetrate a 100 yards or so off the levee. They need to use Full Tracks, Wheel Buggies, Airboats and anything else that will get the trappers to the tree islands. Mike Kimmel, the Python Cowboy, was next to me nodding his head in agreement. I asked the Governor to drop the restrictions on the use of motorized vehicles in the Everglades, and open access of the entire area. We have to use every tool possible. He did not commit, but he looked right at Ron Bergeron. Ron said we will put this together and use all the tools we have. Now we all know there are political ramifications to whatever they do, but if we can get the Everglades opened back up, and show them the value of who we are and what we can do, it is now. They have a need and Ron Bergeron knows what he can do with our help. He emphasized several times <u>WE</u> are all in this together. It is a first step. But of course, the next day there was an article in the Sun Sentinel. The reporter asked Florida Wildlands about the plan. Their spokesman, Matthew Schwartz said we will have to look over the plan and see if they are going to let Off Road Vehicles in. I guess they think Wildlands or wildernesses will look pristine if there are no animals out there to eat the grasses. Everybody, and I mean everybody, better realize the seriousness of this python problem.

I also spoke to National Park Service Biologist, J. Unger. I told him I realized the NPS reluctance to let motorized vehicles into National Parks, However; I said, "you guys know Everglades National Park is Ground Point Zero for this Python problem." He said yes it was. I said, "even if these vehicles beat your grasses to the ground, in 1 year you won't even know they were there." He agreed to that statement. He also said there are laws they have to abide by, I told him I understood, and I am not asking you to break the law, but it needs to be changed. Or at a minimum waived off for a few years, and if we are good neighbors leave it in place, if not revoke it. He told me there is some new technology that has come about recently in the form of a Pheromone traps. One way of testing the effectiveness of this technology is to chip a few hundred rabbits. They have already done this and all of the rabbits were eaten in 4 months. If the new methods are effective, the rabbits should live a lot longer than that. If not, call in the Gladesmen Trappers and or the public. I hope every one of you who got this newsletter read this entire article. As a club member, and as Gladesmen, the Everglades is under attack by several invasive species. Our Residential Communities and waterways are under attack by Iguanas. Drastic times call for drastic measures, we need to act. It is my hope that Ron Bergeron can convince the Governor and all of the environmental groups to work together and solve these problems. I hope you agree with the direction the club is going and you can help solve this problem. Hope to see you at the Banquet or in the Glades soon, your club is going to need your support both financially and physically. Many hands make light work, Let us all work together to protect our Everglades.
