I left from my ranch in Martin County, drove south a little over 2 hours and was out in the swamp searching my first spoil island, hunting pythons an hour after sunrise... Unfortunately I did not have the weather in my favor, it was the hottest it's been and the sun was at full strength. Our Florida summer sun is just too hot for the pythons, that's why I often go out to catch them hunting for prey at night.

I wasn't going to let the heat discourage me, I knew this was my only day to hunt the islands this month and the timing was right to find nests. After maybe 3-4 hours and searching 10 islands I found an absolute monster of a python. Being what looked like over 17 feet long she was impressive to say the least and considering the time of year most likely gravid with eggs. She didn't seem bothered by me being there but definitely kept an eye on me. From there I decided on a game plan.... which was basically to grab her by the tail and see what I was made of lol.

I've caught large pythons before but usually by the head first and not in so much vegetation. Grabbing by the head is easier and safer but in this situation it was going to be difficult to get up to where her head was for the grab without spooking her. So I committed to grabbing the tail and holding on! After grabbing her tail she immediately overpowered me and started to drag me into the thick grass, off the island. I dug my heels into the limestone and pulled back as hard as I could, stopping her.

We were then at a standstill, a python tug of war I guess you could say. From there she started to come for me, which is what I wanted... this will give me a chance to grab her head and finish tiring her out. She struck a couple times but being as large as she is I was able to dodge the strikes pretty easily... I was doing well until she surprised me with a second half strike, after I dodged a full strike first, catching me on my left arm and hitting multiple large veins.

Luckily, it was a clean bite and I was able to quickly pull her off without teeth breaking off in me or her pulling me in to wrap me up; but once I noticed how much blood I was losing I knew I had to be careful. I was mostly worried about blacking out or getting weak, especially with how hot it was... I wasn't trying to become a python turd lol. I was able to grab her behind her head when she bit me and carefully finished tiring her out. I then quickly used the snake bag I brought with me as a tourniquet because I still had to drag her back to my 14' Jon boat where my pistol was.... boy was that fun!

A couple pints of blood, a gallon of sweat and a few curse words later I had her in the boat and ready to be euthanized. I'm still waiting on official measurements from the state to find out if she's a record breaker or not but either way I'm a happy man! I don't think I'll be making products out of this skin... keeping as a trophy and to take with me to different events I do around the state with the History of the Florida Gladesmen and Mobile Museum, speaking about invasive species.

The Lord and the swamp always provides!!!
