

## Where's UGANDA?

- Uganda is on the Equator and one of most densely populated countries in Africa with a population of 45 million, most of which make a living by farming or selling items at the market. Only 25% of the people live in urban areas.
- The official languages of Uganda are English and Swahili, while Luganda, is spoken widely too.
- It borders five countries (Kenya, South Sudan, the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC), Rwanda and Tanzania) and is one of the poorest/most corrupt in Africa.
- Uganda has the world's youngest population!

### Rich Natural Resources with pervasive poverty



- Economy of Uganda: great potential & could have rapid economic growth. Is endowed with significant natural resources: ample fertile land, regular rainfall, and mineral deposits.
- Challenges: Chronic political instability and erratic economic management since the implementation of self-rule has unfortunately produced a record of persistent economic decline that has left Uganda among the world's poorest and least-developed countries. The informal economy is predominantly female.



## Agriculture-based Economy

- Agriculture is one of the most important sectors of Ugandan economy, employing 72% of the work force.
- Uganda has very rich ground and can have up to 4 harvest seasons instead of 2 in one year with water pumps.
- Uganda is 90th poorest country in world, out of 195 (less than \$110/mo average income).
- Almost 22% of the country is below the poverty line.
- Low level of education--parents must pay for a child to attend school (This means that a 14 year old boy or girl could be attending 2<sup>nd</sup> grade due to lack of funds).



## Long-Term Sustainability





Giving key leaders and pastors essential tools & training to be self-sufficient for years include:

- Continued impact for the larger community

### Progression of Brian's Projects in 2022 Started K-5 school with 6 teachers for 118 kids (7 orphans, 15 from single-parent families, most others with absent father), providing them one good meal/day. Built all structures, and for sustainability, sowed land for corn, bought a motorcycle for transport, is raising pigs and chickens, all of which are already helping reduce operating costs.










### **Brian's Projects' Direction for 2023:**

Building an additional 4 rooms for Kindergartners and fence, Hiring 4 additional teachers, Passing inspection for school licensing, Sustainable food sources, & funding for daily school operations given the poverty of families (less than 10% of budget currently provided).





# Brian Bbosa's Dominion Life Junior School

#### Details:

- 118 students
- 63 paying minimal fee of \$28/term
- 55 cannot pay anything
- Working with parents to pay something by helping with crops and land work
- Crops/Piggery beginning to contribute to budget

#### Projects: \$22,050

- Construction of 4 classrooms: \$8200
- Completion of 3 other classrooms, furniture and area fencing: \$6150
- Building housing for teachers: \$1500
- Cost of 4 more teachers for year: \$2800
- Basic playground Items: \$1400
- Purchase land with road access: \$2,000
- Yearly cost for scholastic materials and food for 118 students and staff: \$1800

Pastor Neckson and their team projects: teaching 384 kids at the school, using a motorbike to coordinate 80 remote churches and their pastors for events, training and funding 100 women in business with more to come!











- 1) School named "Childcare Center" for 384 Kids' Needs: \$14,650
  - Desk: \$1800
  - Toilets: \$1100
  - Library/books (kids have nothing of their own):\$1700
  - 13 Teachers pay: \$1950
  - Porridge for kids (60+ orphans and rest below poverty line): \$4100
  - Basic IT and power supply items: \$1500
  - Crop items (water pump, seed): \$1500


2) 50 Women's Small Business Start-up Costs, using Chickens: \$3200

- 2 Chicken and Rooster (\$37 each): \$1850
- Chicken coop \$27 each: \$1350

3) Poultry Small Business Start-up Project for 50 families (chickens initially housed in one location): \$2200

- Construction of chicken coop and tools: \$1000
- 200 chicks with vet care, feed and supplies: \$1200


Pastor Wilson and his team's projects have seen much progress with a motorcycle to visit remote locations, access to computer and teachings, reaching 1500 teens through his 180 young leaders in 7 church zones with youth conferences, women in biz training/startups, sanitary pads project and caring for the community in many other practical ways!











- Capital for 20 women: \$600
- Accounting books and tools: \$100

- 2) Sanitary Pad Project for 7000 families over 3 years: \$12,000
- 2 Sewing machines: \$600
- Construction of Workshop: \$2100
- Basic IT and power supply items--\$1000
- Cotton supplies: \$1600
- Plastic packaging: \$1800
- Marketing: \$440

- 3) Poultry Small Business Start-up Project for 50 families (chickens initially housed in one location): \$2,200
- Construction of chicken coop and tools: \$1000
- 200 chicks with vet care, feed and supplies: \$1200



- 4) Piggery Project for 20 families over 3 years: \$1700
- Construction of pigsty and tools and vet service: \$1100
- 1 Female pig per family: \$558
