Uganda Projects

Pastor Brian Bbosa near Nsalo Uganda. He is Owner, Pastor, and Principal at the Dominion Life Junior School. Pastor Brian and his staff teach 125 children and care for 10 orphans. They are the top education school in their region. They are also working towards sustainability. We have been working with them to reach this goal and we are well on the way to reaching it by the end of 2024. Praise God for His Faithfulness! For now, we are working on a few projects to help them with the school. Here are a few of the projects.

Projects:

1. Finishing the Primary school building -- \$6650







Most important at the moment is placing steel beams on the building. Steel Beams will be used across the window openings to secure walls from falling and keep deterioration of bricks from happening. 2. Expanding the pig building to accommodate the increased number of pigs and piglets -- \$800



We will finish closing in this structure with concrete and boards and placing a chicken coop on top of the Piggery. Saves space and chicken manure helps with the pig food for the pigs.



3.Cow --\$900



4. Two goats \$200



 5. Chicken coop will be added on top of the pig building to conserve space and utilize the chicken manure for the pigs.
Also the coop keeps the Hawks from eating the chickens --\$950



The Piggery Building, Cows, Goats and Chicken Coop are to further the living improvements for the existing livestock and make room for more livestock. These steps are for the sustainability of the school and feeding the staff and children.

Pastor Wilson and Annette Mutegeki – Ibanda Chanya Town, Uganda

1. <u>Tailoring -- \$8150 (includes the building. There is no competition for this</u> <u>business in an active community of over 10,000 people.</u>

Led by Annette. Will involve 4 main income generating activities: 1) making of reusable sanitary pads; 2) cloth making and designing; 3) shoe/ bags making; 4) knitting.

Investment total for materials: \$4300

- Buying the house **\$2150** (plus **\$800** already deposited)
- (The plot behind the two roomed house, has space for 3 more rooms 12 by 10 feet and the space behind the three rooms of 34 by 50 feet, will help us in carpentry project.) Renovation of the house: electricity, doors, cementing and wash rooms) \$ 1500
- One-time training for 3 workers for shoe and bag making/ repair skills \$200
- Materials **\$1100** (Cloth material, bags and shoe making material, pad making material, threads, books of account etc.)
- 2 manual Sewing machine \$400
- 1 electric sewing machine \$400
- 1 Baby lock machine \$400
- Designing machine \$600
- Cloth punch and button machines **\$200**
- Shoe trimming machine. **\$300**
- Leather sewing machine \$600
- Shelves/tables/benches \$300


Total sales per month expected around **\$800.** In addition to Annette, workers to directly benefit are **6**, 4 ladies and 2 men. It's Their fulltime job; level of education 3 trained tailors, 2 experienced in pad making, 1 trained in business management. With good word of mouth in the weekly market and churches, each worker can up to **\$50** - **\$100** (average income is \$52). After paying wages and electricity the profit is expected to be \$200 per month, beginning the first month. Ten percent of the total net profit per month will be put into the DLU account for ministry to youth, creating more businesses and other projects to benefit the community, while remainder goes back into the business.







Great shoe products are just one of the many items that can be made with sewing machines and jobs for the community.



Sewing Machines will allow them to produce very needed and affordable clothing for the community.

1. CARPENTRY - total investment \$7300.

Led by Wilson Mutegeki with 7 young, trained reliable workers. This project will have a great impact on the Ibanda Chanya Town community with these qualities.


Investment

- Wooden Structure in the space behind bank MAPT **\$500**
- Electricity for the structure \$300
- Wood Plaining machine \$1500
- 4 Wood designing machines **\$2000**
- Tool boxes **\$500**
- Grinder machines **\$300**
- Paint Spraying machines **\$1000**
- In puts wood, paints, sandpaper \$1000
- Show room hire for one year \$200

Wilson and 7 workers will earn **\$50** - **\$100** per month, from the project. Net profit each month expected: **\$500** profit after paying workers and electricity with 10% allocated to DLU for ministry and outreaches and creation of more businesses while remainder goes back into the business.

Market benefits:

- The machines can run for 20 years without replacement of the motors
- Carpentry product is higher quality compared to other businesses because of additional service and high quality machines.
- Wood and electricity easily accessible
- Employment options for unschooled and trained youth in future

2. <u>Soap making -- \$600</u>

Led by faithful leaders Elijah and wife are currently making soap out of their home in Maliba town, not far from Wilson and Annette. Will train 2 more workers to work in production and sales.

Invest to boost the ongoing business.

Chemicals: \$500

Packing and branding: \$100

Will be able to produce total profit of **\$100** per month continuously and will be giving 10% to DLU each month.

3. Hawkers' business --\$1200


Led by faithful and accountable Lucky Jovia. Eight mission team members are doing this already and with good experience and skill (Joel, Jovia, Swizborn, Eve, Jesca, Willy, Makanika, Colvin)

Investment \$ 1200

They each deal in different businesses:

- 2 deal in cell phones
- 1 deals in jewelry
- 2 in food stuffs
- 1 deals in used clothes
- 1 in general merchandise

They sow willingly into the community and 20% of their profit goes to DLU and 80% begins more businesses. (Jovia with Roberta and the young man is Joel)



4. Give a Goat Project \$ 1300

Lead by Rev. Elisha to bless young leaders and elderly faithful pastors

Begin with 20 mature goats each at \$65

There are 20 faithful people ready to take on the project. 10 pastors and 10 young leaders.

A goat gives birth 2 times a year, on average 2 kid goats per birth. These 20 people will give/sow a goat into 20 people in the first year so they can start a business. Since a goat takes one year to mature and to give birth, this will be a revolving process and a growing business over time.

Positives to Business: Goats don't need a costly different shelter like pigs. They need no medication or vaccination. Easily ready for market at maturity. Easy to feed and easy to keep by a variety of people.
