Please join me in congratulating the scholarship recipients who will be going to some of the top universities in the country and the Air Force Academy. Sincere thanks and appreciation to the CPC volunteers who have worked over the years to make this happen. In 1993, CPC President Virginia Wong reported 100 scholarships had been awarded. As of tonight, that number has increased to 517. The fund itself is 12-fold larger than in 1993 thanks to your participation and generosity. 
