Life is fleeting, and when we're not mindful of that, we can end up living with regret when our loved ones pass from this life.

We saw the **correlation between knowledge and grief**. The more we know, the more our eyes are opened to things around us. The more we look outward, the more we grieve when we see others

Solomon's wisdom did not prevent him from living foolishly. He asked God for wisdom to govern Israel (1 Kings 3:9), and God gave him that wisdom. However, that did not stop Solomon from setting his **mind**, not his heart, to know things, nor did he appear to ask God any questions; instead, he sought to find answers on his own.

"For who has known the Lord's mind, that he may instruct him?" (1 Corinthians 2:16). This verse gave us reason to ponder how little we truly do understand. Because we can't see the big picture that God sees, our understanding is a drop in the bucket. When we acknowledge we won't understand, it launches us into another level of freedom, so we can stop going around in circles trying to comprehend things our minds are not meant to comprehend.

There's really nothing new under the sun. For instance, even though we've not experienced a global pandemic called COVID before, others have experienced plagues and other diseases. In essence, a plague is a plague no matter the name!

We asked ourselves, "What can we take away from Solomon's discourse on everything being futile and the limitations of wisdom? To answer our question, we reflected on how those dealing with chronic pain reach a place of understanding that the things in this world really are meaningless. Dreams. Cars. Careers. Money. Houses. None of it is going to last, and we surely can't take any of that with us!

The only thing that has eternal value is what we do for God. When we change our perspective and shift our priorities, we can then chase the things that matter WHILE living under the sun, yet not taking stock in those things happening under the sun.

Living a life before others that glorifies God matters. Jesus came by Himself. He went to the Cross by Himself, but He brought us with Him when He went to heaven. That's how we're seated in heavenly places. Likewise, it's possible we take souls that are saved through our witness with us. Those souls are the increase! They are the fruit!

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Psalm 90:12 is a request for God to teach us to **number our days so we might have a heart of wisdom**. Being more mindful of our limited time on earth can help us cultivate an eternal mindset.

We can't change the past, but we can learn from it and do something different going forward.

There's a difference between **leaving a legacy or leaving an inheritance** for those in our sphere of influence. When our children grow up to the do what they saw us do in our walk with the Lord, such as our praise and worship in times of trial, we have left an inheritance. As for the material things we leave behind, who can say how others will manage that. Therefore, a **generational impartation** is an inheritance we leave that's more important than leaving "things."

Everything under the sun truly is futile and worldly wisdom is vanity ... empty! Moreover, worldly wisdom will lead us astray! It will cause us to think we're so smart, yet we're confidently going down the wrong path because WE think it's the right one!

Solomon wanted to know about madness and folly AND wisdom and knowledge. Understanding madness and folly can lead to our making a course correction, but too much madness and folly can be destructive. On the flip side, there's more clarity in hindsight, so by asking ourselves why we did or thought something, we can gain wisdom and knowledge through the practice of self-reflection.

Some highlights from our takeaways

Everything "under the sun" may be futile, but it's not futile when it's "under the Son!" Moreover, lessons learned under the sun can help us grow closer to the Son!

Chasing after things and people is wearisome but chasing after God is not! After all, we **can't** take things with us, but we **can take people**!

Generations come and go. Ecclesiastes 1:11 reminds us that, even in our generation, there are people some children will never remember, because they were too young!
