**TOPICS DISCUSSED.** During this meeting, we discussed the following:

Closing the Loop on Lesson 1 - Introducing the Parable of the Sower and the Seed. We heard some additional insight into each of the soils:

- Wayside/Path. This is when the soil of our heart is barren, disheveled, and lacks understanding.
- Rocky. The soil of our heart is hard. There are little to no roots. Other words used to
  describe this soil were: withered, exposed, vulnerable, and doesn't withstand hardship.
  We also looked back at the revelation, "Weeds destroy, but roots break up," from our
  January 21, 2020 Meeting Notes. I shared how this reminded me of how Scripture talks
  about breaking up fallow ground (Jeremiah 4:3).
- **Thorny.** Our heart is prickly. Other descriptions were painful and distracting. In addition, the worries, deceitfulness of riches, and the pleasures of life keep us from maturing.
- **Good.** This is when our heart is healthy! There's growth. We hear and accept. We remember, and our heart is noble and good.

Nuggets from the Evening. Here are the nuggets I jotted down during our discussion:

- No matter what happens, don't let yourself get in the thorns. UPDATE: Recent events have led me to wonder if this is something we actually need to avoid. From past experience, I've learned, even though it's the most painful season, it's also the one that produces the deepest healing!
- We discussed how not really trusting God will take care of "it," whatever "it" is, is what disturbs our ability to trust, which causes us to pick "it" back up, again and again.
- Being okay with other people's free will continues to be a challenge for some.

**Our Stories.** Because of a recent loss, we chose not to delve into Lesson 2, but to spend the rest of the evening sharing our story. Even though everyone is connected to me, but not to each other, it helped us get to know one another better. It was a very insightful time as we got to hear about key events that shaped each of us.
