**Recognizing our "Ites."** We opened with "Speak to the Mountains," because not only can we make mountains out of molehills, but there are also times we need to speak to the mountain (Mark 11:23). (See update on **attachment 1**).

**Ecclesiastes 9. My takeaway** from this chapter is in the attached H.E.A.R.T Worksheet. Other nuggets from our discussion:

In v2-3, Solomon's take on our common destiny was a bit disturbing, because it implies what we do doesn't matter towards our final destiny. However, we know, without Jesus, we all have a common destiny, so everything "under the sun" is futile if it's not done "under the Son." Thus, without the right perspective, sometimes, it can be hard to do right when someone else is doing wrong, which raised the question, "If you could do wrong, would you take the risk?" This eye-opening statement led us to James 5:20: "Whoever turns a sinner from the error of his way will save his soul from

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death and cover over a multitude of sins." Because of this covering, no person's work or performance should define how they operate in grace and love!



**In v6**, we noted how we can place more importance on things like status, especially financial status, while still ignoring poor people.

**In v8,** Solomon says to "always anoint your head with oil," but as Christians, we tend to think of only the Lord anointing our heads with oil.

**In v9**, it was the second time that week one of us had heard, "Enjoy life." It was a reminder for her that life is not just about working. Thus, one of her takeaways was to enjoy life more and be thankful and being thankful will help her enjoy life!

**In v10**, "Whatever your hands find to do" is part of one of our personal visions. Moreover, even in a worldly way, we know if we're going to do something to do it right!

In v17-18, the quiet words of the wise stood out, because we need wisdom to know how to use our "weapons of war." We also need to learn about the different armor pieces and pray for guidance on how to use them, because one bad seed (or act) can cause of lot of damage, much like when trust is broken. Trust is small, but it can easily be broken yet can be hard to repair. However, wisdom can be a fruit that prevents this destruction and can also help us avoid war!

While discussing trust, we noted how the enemy tries to throw us off track by making things look like we don't want them to. However, if we know this about our enemy, why would we think things are going to be simple and look like we want them to?

While discussing wisdom, we noted waiting before we speak can also help us avoid causing destruction! After all, we don't know other's perspective or how they perceive a situation, nor do they know ours. However, if we are walking in love, "love thinks no evil," (1 Corinthians 13:5 NKJV).

#### Homework

Read Ecclesiastes 10 and pick your one takeaway about what's happening "under the sun" which is the theme of this book. If you'd like, you can use the H.E.A.R.T worksheet, but it's not required.

Prayerfully ponder the "Ites" and ask the Holy Spirit to identify yours as it relates to how you answered the vision questions and your one word/Scripture.

Overall, despite Ecclesiastes being depressing, there is practical application we took from it:

- Watch our words
- Enjoy life
- Rest in God, knowing resting is not about being lazy
- Keep our oil lamps filled, which encompasses all the above

**Prayer Request Log.** I introduced a log to help us better keep up with our prayer requests & praise reports in a more concise way so we can praise God when He answers our prayers!

### Some highlights from our takeaways

Even though Ecclesiastes is heavy, knowing who we are helps us get through the depressing parts; also, this is at least one place where we see that love will cover a multitude of sins.

The more we learn, the thicker our belt of truth gets. Likewise, the more Word we learn, the more Scriptures we know for different situations, and that creates more peace in our lives.

"Ite"	What it Represents in Our Lives	Question to ask Ourselves
Canaanites	Represents a "peddler."	What lies is the devil "peddling" to us to replace the truth of God's Word?
Hittites	Represents "terror."	What are we responding to out of terror instead of faith in God?
Hivites	Represents a "villager."	What strongholds, "living places," are we creating in our lives for the enemy's lies to live in? What behavior in us is those strongholds "giving life" to?
Perizzites	Represents "open country" or a place "without walls."	What areas of our lives have we not established boundaries based on God's Word?

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# H.E.A.R.T WORKSHEET

### ATTACHMENT 2: Scripture(s): Ecclesiastes 9:17-18

### TAKEAWAY: What is the one thing that stood out to you in this lesson?

How words and wisdom are connected, especially since my entire vision for this year is about words!

#### Now, let's submit our H.E.A.R.T to the LORD:

H. What do you hear in this passage: information, application, or revelation?

Information and application. In v17, we don't have to be loud to speak words of wisdom, and then in v18, it reiterates that we can have our weapons of war (our armor), but for it to be effective, we also need wisdom, because without it, there can be a ripple affect around us ... one sinner destroys much good! This reminds me of Achan and when his actions had a ripple effect on the outcome of the battle at Ai (Joshua 7). Likewise, my words can have a ripple effect on someone else's reputation or even the outcome of things God has spoken to me.

E - What fruit, if any, can you expect to produce in your life based on this Word?

Proverbs 18:21 says that death and life are in the power of the tongue, so as I go through 2023 with specific words, I can expect to produce fruit (good or bad) based on the words I speak. If I want good fruit, I need to use wisdom in my speech, and it needs to impart grace to those who hear it, because where grace is, so is the Spirit of the Lord.

A - What **action(s)**, if any, do you need to take to cultivate the seed of this Word in your life?

I need to pause before I speak and listen more carefully to the things I say. There's a Hebrew word, LaShon hara that means "evil speech." And I don't want my speech to be evil, so I need to be more mindful of what I say!

**R** - Do you believe this Word enough for you to **rest** in it as truth you accept and, if necessary, can obey? If not, what hinders you?

I definitely believe it enough to rest in it as truth, and I believe it enough to know that God can help me with it, because He already has. I just have to continue to stay focused on cultivating good speech that aligns with Ephesians 4:29 to impart grace to the hearers!

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**I** - Do you **trust** the Father with this Word even if things don't look like you want them to? If not, what hinders you?

Yes! Simply because He has already done so much for me in this area. I no longer spout off at the mouth in anger like I used to and for that I am grateful!

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
