anything man can do, God can do exponentially better! So, even though the world is out of control, God is not. He is still in control!

In v10-12, the more we have the more we want, and the more we worry about what we have – we're **never satisfied**. This reminded us of Proverbs 15:27, Proverbs 1:19, and Matthew 6:19. This mindset makes it easy for us to love God for what He gives us rather than for who He is.

We discussed how **we can't take our possessions with us**. We also noted even if we squandered everything we have, hopefully, we learn something from it. For example, if we lost our earthly treasures, there must be a reason, and if it's ill-gotten from us, God is able to make us whole.

We had a **personal testimony** of how losing what she had turned into a blessing and helped her turn to God.

We discussed how we process what we read and what we hear through our own filter, even though that may not be how it was intended, since **different perspectives** can cause the Word to hit different.

We can be so independent, we don't understand how much we need God. He is multi-faceted, but we only get glimpses.

Thankfully, **our differences** make us stronger together, with God and with each other.

Ecclesiastes is Old Testament, and since we are on the other side of the promise they were waiting for, we have a **different perspective**. And for that, we are very blessed.

The **greatest feeling** is being able to put our hands down and then watch God go to work! That testimony allows us to share about His goodness! And when we give God His glory, it becomes seed that can be planted in the heart of unbelievers!

In v13-17, we noted how sitting in frustration and anger is a mindset we choose to hang on to. There's always something we can be thankful for!

In v18-20, enjoy the good things in life and thank the Lord for it.

In v19, "This is a gift of God" led to the quote, "This is the gift of God. Whether a meal or a mansion, it is a gift from God, not from your labor, and be thankful to Him for it. Don't reject the gift! Recognize the gift is from Him and have joy in it."
