We opened our evening in prayer and then began our discussion to finish Ecclesiastes chapter 7:15-29.

DISCUSSION

In v16, we noted you can be so spiritually minded that you're no earthly good – you're disconnected! Jesus corrected the Pharisees, because they spent so much time in the Law, while disconnected from the people and not helping others.

In v17, we noted, how being excessively wicked and being foolish can lead to an early death!

In v20, we noted when someone falls, any excessive righteousness on our part is hypocrisy, because as the verse points out, "There is certainly no one righteous on the earth who does good and never sins" (emphasis added). Romans 2:1 even talks about judging others and we're doing the same thing. We're not giving room for grace and mercy. Moreover, people can be anointed and broken. Those anointed by God can still have brokenness they're healing through. However, when we look up to them, we can end up praising the anointing to the point that we overlook their humanity! Bottomline is, "Who appointed us as judge?" especially since we make such terrible judges!

In v19-22, we noted how these verses remind us of Proverbs!

In v23, we noted wisdom that's independent of God is worldly wisdom.



In v23-24, we're always at the tip of the iceberg when it comes to God. There's so much to know about Him that we can never know it all! We're on the journey of eternity to fully grasp God. Even the simplest concepts can baffle us! After all, what we know and what we believe may not be the same. But our goal is to believe God, knowing He con do one thing in many ways, so choose to believe in Him, rather than in what He does. It doesn't matter what someone else is experiencing. If we don't believe God for ourselves, what we're believing for won't happen, which does sometimes happen in our relationship with God! We believe He's saying that He has the bridge, but we don't want to go over it, because it doesn't look sturdy enough.

In v25, we looked at Solomon's comparison of "wickedness is stupidity and folly is madness." According to Strong's Exhaustive Concordance application, the original definition for "wickedness" is "wrong," and "folly" contained words like "silliness" and "stupidity." So, we concluded folly is not intentional, but more about acting in the wrong way at the wrong time! In other words, lacking good sense!

In v26, there's a Proverb that talks about avoiding the adulteress. However, it takes being pleasing to God to escape that trap. Moreover, because of who might be watching, when the enemy causes someone to fall, there may well be a ripple effect for those observing their walk! Sadly, it's the familiarity we cultivate in inappropriate relationships that can lead to a foothold for Satan to get in!

In v27, Solomon's saying, "adding one thing to another," reminded us of the verse that talks about "line upon line, precept upon precept" (Isaiah 28:10 New King James Version). In essence, everything adds upon itself until it eventually produces fruit.

In v27-29, we noted even though God made us upright, our sinful nature causes us to pursue sinful schemes over upright ones. We even looked at verse 29 in the Amplified Version and clearly saw this verse explains "how God can allow people to do bad things." It's because He made us upright, but WE decide to pursue "many schemes."
