What is saline tattoo removal?

Saline tattoo removal is a method of removing pigment from skin using a saline solution. This solution will bind to the pigments, break them down and draw them to the surface of the skin. Several sessions are generally required to get desired results.

Ideal candidates:

- You have small tattoos (no bigger than a deck of cards) or microblading/permanent makeup.
- You don't have any severe skin or health conditions or take medications that may prolong your skin from healing.

Not so ideal candidates:

- Your tattoo is large or heavily colored, laser may be better suited for your removal
- Your skin is prone to keloid scars
- You're diabetic

What is the healing process like?

The healing process is similar to when you first had the tattoo done, but will be flakier and itchier as the pigment is drawn to the skin surface and scabs off. Keep the area as DRY as possible for the first several days until scabs start to form. The most important thing is to NOT pick or pull at the scabs, these must fall off naturally. Oftentimes the area might present some lymph fluid drainage and in that case, just blot the area with a clean paper towel or unscented tissues. If you are removing permanent makeup it's best to live out the healing process before putting any makeup on or around the area. Try not to saturate the area in water. The area must be left dry for best results. After the scabs form and start to fall off, vitamin E oil is great to rehydrate your skin.
