**CANDIDATE WESTON MARTINEZ CALLS FOR IMMEDIATE
INVESTIGATION
INTO ANOMALOUS VOTER RECORDS DISCOVERED IN
BEXAR COUNTY REPUBLICAN PRIMARY DATA**

Files Formal Complaints with Bexar County, Texas Secretary of State, and U.S. House of Representatives; Demands Immediate Preservation of All Election Data and Records

SAN ANTONIO, TX — Weston Martinez, Conservative Republican candidate for U.S. Congress in Texas' 21st Congressional District, today called for an immediate investigation into serious anomalies discovered in Bexar County Republican primary early voting poll pad data. Martinez is simultaneously filing formal complaints with Bexar County election officials, the Texas Secretary of State, and the United States House of Representatives.

A preliminary forensic analysis conducted by Dr. Andrew Paquette, in collaboration with other independent researchers, has identified 4,110 voter records in the February 18, 2026 early voting check-in data bearing mathematically impossible fractional State Voter Identification numbers. Texas State Voter ID numbers are whole-number integers by definition. Not one of these 4,110 fractional IDs exists in the Texas statewide voter database.

The pattern identified is consistent with automated, software-generated injection rather than human error. The gap between every consecutive anomalous record is identical — 22,084.82189 — producing a mathematically perfect integer result across all 4,110 records. Each anomalous record is anchored to a real registered voter's name, with 735 genuine voters appearing to have been duplicated five or six times each. Each record would have generated a ballot.

Additionally, all 14 CSV files in the Bexar County early voting dataset were subsequently replaced on Bexar Election Archives in what appears to have been a synchronized 78-second automated batch operation. The original data survives only because it was captured and distributed to precinct chairs on February 19, before the replacement occurred.

“This investigation is preliminary, and we are actively seeking a statement and explanation from Bexar County,” said Martinez. “There may be an explanation. But let me be absolutely clear: whether this is the result of a malfunction or manipulation,

neither is acceptable. Either explanation confirms that electronic voting systems are incapable of conducting elections that the people of Texas can verify and trust.”

Martinez today announced the following actions:

- 1. Formal Complaint to Bexar County:** Demanding a full investigation into the anomalous records, an explanation for the synchronized replacement of all 14 early voting data files, and a halt to certification of the early voting results pending a complete physical canvass of every voter on the record and full hand count audit.
- 2. Formal Complaint to the Texas Secretary of State:** Requesting an immediate statewide investigation into the integrity of KnowInk poll pad and all electronic pollbook systems used across Texas and a review of all electronic voting system certifications under Texas Election Code §122.001.
- 3. Formal Complaint to the United States House of Representatives:** Notifying Congress of potential irregularities in a federal congressional primary election and requesting oversight and investigation.
- 4. Demand for Immediate Data Preservation:** Calling on Bexar County, the Texas Secretary of State, KnowInk, and all relevant parties to immediately preserve all election data, records, logs, poll pad data, ballot images, chain of custody documentation, text and email messages and any other materials related to the March 2026 Republican primary. Destruction or alteration of any records will be treated as evidence of spoliation.

“The people of District 21 deserve to know that their votes count — and only their votes count,” Martinez continued. *“In a primary where margins can be measured in hundreds of votes, 4,110 anomalous ballot-generating records cannot be dismissed. I am calling on every relevant authority to act immediately and transparently.”*

A MESSAGE TO DISTRICT 21 VOTERS

Martinez urged supporters and all District 21 Republican voters to make a plan to vote on Election Day and to cast their ballots in person.

“This is exactly why we fight for election integrity. Do not let this discourage you — let it fuel you. Make your plan. Show up on Election Day. Vote. Your voice matters, and I am fighting every single day to make sure it is heard. I’m asking for your vote for U.S. Congress, Texas District 21, because I will never stop fighting for free and fair elections.”

District 21 includes Bandera, Bexar, Blanco, Comal, Gillespie, Hays, Kendall, Kerr, and Real counties.
