I have been writing and talking about DEI for more than two years, but never has DEI been under attack as it is as we begin 2025 and look forward toward a new era in our history. The backlash against DEI is palpable. So, rather than discussing the inconsistencies in statements made towards DEI, I am simply going to redefine what DEI is.

DEI is Diversity, Equity and Inclusion. So, what do these words mean in general and as they pertain to AAUW!

**DIVERSITY:** Diversity means differences among people with respect to age, class, ethnicity, gender, health, physical and mental ability, sexual orientation, religion, physical size, education level, job, physical traits and other human differences. So, for AAUW it basically means being representative of the community in which we live.

**EQUITY:** Equity refers to fairness and justice and is distinguished from equality where everyone is treated equally. Equity recognizes that we don't start from the same place and that we need to make adjustments to imbalances. For AAUW it means taking into consideration the special needs for those who cannot drive at night, are not technologically literate, cannot hear at a distance, are not available during "work" hours and more. We need to make sure that each of our members has an equal opportunity to participate in the AAUW activities and be successful.

**INCLUSION:** Inclusion is the practice of including and accommodating people who have historically been excluded because of factors which could include race, age, gender, religion, sexuality or ability. As a diversity advocate once said, "Diversity is being invited to the party and Inclusion is being asked to dance." For AAUW, it means welcoming newcomers, regardless of their diverse backgrounds, to sit at your table, participate on a committee, offer their ideas, share their customs and traditions and more.

My hope is that when you hear disparaging remarks about DEI, you remember what DEI is and NOT what some are describing it as.

We had a full house last month to hear our guest speaker, Yvonne Dobbenga Rhodes, RN, present us with a history of reproductive rights, our current state of affairs, & her take about the future. I know it was hard to put such a broad topic into a 45-minute time slot! It was especially good to see so many there, including some "young blood", especially since the meeting was not in our usual place (& then it was moved again at the last minute).

## The fight continues...

Former-president Biden stated before he left office that the Equal Rights Amendment is the law of the land. So why is there any debate? It is not currently a part of the Constitution, & we aren't clear on it's ratification status. It was first introduced in Congress in December 1923! It was reintroduced by Representative Martha Griffiths in 1971 & approved by the U.S. House of Representatives that same year & the U.S. Senate the following year, thus sending it to the states for ratification. This didn't happen within the deadline provided or the deadline's extension. Actually, not until 4 years ago did Virginia become the 38th & final state needed to ratify the amendment, despite occurring almost 4 decades after the deadline. So, is this a real amendment? The National Archivist, who is responsible for certifying & publishing new amendments, says that the Congress or the courts needs to lift the deadline. So while many of us thought this was already law, it's still up in the air.
