## the park...

It is essential that as well as regular visits to Happy Dogs Daycare, your dog continues to enjoy the benefits of regular walks to complement the social interaction and exercise they receive in our arena. # Paw pad check & ear clean and check:

Earlier this we year we began offering a monthly service for general health and well-being checks for your dogs' paws and ears. These preventative checks are designed to help identify any onset of injury or infection which can be common in these areas. Even minor health issue can develop into something more serious if left untreated and this can lead to costly vet bills. It is always far better to address any problems early on when treatment is much easier, quicker, affordable and mostly importantly less harmful to your dog.

In our paw pad checks we trim the nails, inspect the dew claws and trim fur around the pads if necessary. We also checked for any sores, abrasions or redness. The hairs between the toes checked for any knots or excessive growth and will be trimmed back if needed.

The ear check is designed to help prevent ear infections. We look for signs of ear mites, sores and/or redness and we will pluck the ear hair if necessary. Plucking hair in the ears promotes air circulation and helps prevent ear infections. These services are offered on alternate months and have gained a very positive response from our customers. We have already caught early signs of infection and slight damage to a foot early enough to not develop into anything serious.

## Retractable Leads...

To retract or not to retract? Here at Happy Dogs we do not encourage the use of retractable leads for the safety of our dogs, and owners. You may think that having a free range to roam up to 26ft on a thin piece of cord is a kind gesture to your dog but please consider the following: The length of cord limits your control of your dog and a nice leisurely stroll can easily turn into a dangerous situation. The handle mechanism in retractable leads is spring loaded, and when your dog takes the run for freedom, the sudden halt when your dog reaches the end of the lead can injure their neck and spine. Your lack of control can also encourage dogs to run into roads, up to dangerous dogs or to unwelcome members of the public. Injuries to owners include finger burns, lacerations and even finger amputations. And think of your pooch, have you ever dropped the big plastic handle? It can scare even the most confident of dogs, causing them to run. These leads are designed to

allow pulling, everything we want to discourage in good lead behaviour. So think again, retract or not to retract...

#### Did you know...

The new animal welfare law that came into effect last year requires an average dog to staff ratio of at most 10 to 1. Here at Happy Dogs our average dog to staff ratio is **5.8 to 1.** 

#### Private hire...

Starting in March 2019 our play arena is now available for private hire events... If you would like to find out more details about hiring the facility for either your own dog training, birthday parties, wet play dates, dog networking groups or breed group meetings / events please call Paul or Adam on 07976 443377. So far we are pleased to have helped a dog rescued and listed under BSL (Breed Specific Legislation), who cannot be allowed off lead in public and must be muzzled when outdoors. Our arena allows dogs and their owners living with such conditions to run and play free without restriction.

#### Summer's coming:

During the coming warmer months we plan to make some minor improvements to the arena and outdoor area. The indoor floor will be repainted, the outdoor area will also get a splash of colour and new doggy splash pools are coming. Repairs and improved lighting will also be made to the Castle play room. The majority of the work will be done out of hours to limit disruption. Recently we added plastic play toys to the arena and are always on the lookout for similar 'Little Tykes' type climbing frames, cars, beds, etc. so if you know of anyone who may wish to donate any used climbing toys please pass on our details.

## Fleaing & Worming..

With the warm weather approaching, it's important to be extra vigilant with flea and worm treatments. Please remember that many such treatments stop working after 4 weeks so it's important to be vigilant.

Dogs can pick up fleas anywhere; they don't necessarily always come from another dog. If your dog goes out in your garden, there could be fleas lurking there, if a cat or even a hedgehog has travelled through. Fleas are both hardy and incredibly sensitive pests. Once they leave their host they are able to go into a type of stasis until they sense the vibrations or warmth of a passing host. ALWAYS buy flea treatment of a reputable brand and avoid the supermarket varieties.

Worming is equally as important, given that some of the species in the environment are quite detrimental to your dog's health; examples are Tape and Round worm, which are often ingested within an infected animal - rabbit for example, or Heart and Lung worms, which are generally caught from slugs and snails. These species are known to be UK wide and some of these parasites can actually be passed onto people - food for thought and another reason to ensure your dog is treated on time, every time.

## It's good to neuter...

We frequently hear that it's good to neuter our dogs, but do we know the details and reasons behind it. After discussions with our consultant vet, we can tell you the following about the advantages of neutering:

- 1) The most obvious being unwanted pregnancy.
- 2) Behavioural improvements with the associated reduction in "sex hormones" and therefore sex drive, dogs (with a few exceptions) will calm down considerably, giving a much more manageable and peaceful pet.
- 3) Health benefits in males it dramatically reduces the risk of developing prostate cancers; in females it minimises the risk of mammary tumours and womb infections, one of the worst being Pyometra, which can be very serious and necessitate an emergency hysterectomy.
