A Legacy Built on Service and Passion

Wamberal Surf Life Saving Club is proud to recognise Peter's lifelong dedication and leadership, that have left an enduring mark on our club, the Central Coast Branch, and the broader Surf Life Saving community. Peter began his lifesaving journey with Manly SLSC in 1961, obtaining his Bronze Medallion in 1962, and by 1968 had already stepped into leadership as Club Treasurer. In 1969, Peter joined Wamberal SLSC, where his impact has been nothing short of remarkable. He became Club Captain in 1971 and went on to serve as President for eleven seasons across the 1970s, '80s, and early '90s.



He also served as Treasurer during multiple terms, demonstrating his unwavering commitment to club operations.

Peter became a Life Member of Wamberal SLSC in 1978 and was awarded Club Person of the Year in 1994. His contributions extended far beyond the club, serving as Treasurer of Central Coast Branch from 1975 to 1980 and President from 1994 to 1997.

Peter played a key role in unifying juniors and seniors into one organisation and securing major sponsorships that supported the growth and sustainability of surf lifesaving across the Central Coast.

Some of his significant initiatives include:

- Launching the Rookie Program and Ducks for Bucks
- Leading the Gosford City Water Safety Levy, which funded the construction of eight new surf clubs
- Contributing to the Finance Committee, Interbranch Team Management, and international touring teams

Peter's influence continues to be felt across the region through these long-standing programs and structures.

Peter was also a Director of Special Projects for Central Coast Branch and served on the Board of Directors for Central Coast Leagues Club.

In 1996, Peter's efforts contributed to the Central Coast Branch being awarded the Australian Department of Sport & Recreation VIP Award for excellence in volunteer management. His recognition includes the Gosford City Mayoral Award for service to the city and being named Hunter Region Sports Administrator of the Year in 1998.

In June 2023, Peter was awarded the Order of Australia Medal (OAM)—a milestone not only for himself but also for Wamberal SLSC, as the first member to receive this prestigious honour.

On behalf of everyone at Wamberal Surf Life Saving Club, we extend our heartfelt congratulations to Peter James OAM. Your service, leadership, and devotion to surf lifesaving are extraordinary, and your legacy will continue to inspire generations of members to come.

A Lifetime of Surf and Service

Wamberal Surf Life Saving Club proudly congratulates Kenn Borgesson on receiving Life Membership of Surf Life Saving Central Coast, recognising over five decades of exceptional and continuous service to surf lifesaving at club, branch, state, and national levels. Kenn joined Wamberal SLSC in January 1973 and obtained his Bronze Medallion in 1975, followed by his Instructors and Examiners awards in 1976 and 1977. He went on to serve an extraordinary 39 consecutive patrol seasons from 1975 to 2014, earning the 35-Year National Patrol Service Award in 2012.



Though now retired from active patrols, Kenn continues to contribute significantly to the movement.

Throughout his time at Wamberal, Kenn served in numerous leadership positions:

Club President (1988-1991)

Club Secretary (1981–1985)

Club Captain (1977–1979)

Chief Instructor (1977–1979, 1994–1996)

Junior Chairman (1975–1979)

He was named Clubman of the Year three times (1976–77, 1978–79, 1979–80) for his tireless work in patrols, training, administration, and competition. In 1990, Kenn was honoured with Life Membership of Wamberal.

Kenn's achievements in lifesaving include:

NSW Lifesaver of the Year (1979–80) – the first recipient from the Central Coast

Central Coast Lifesaver of the Year (1983) and finalist (1981–82)

As a District Supervisor, he played a key role supporting under-resourced clubs by mentoring new trainers and helping candidates attain their Bronze Medallions.

At the Branch level, Kenn's roles included:

Vice President - Nipperettes (5 years)

Branch Superintendent (1980–81)

Board of Examiners Member (1980–1990)

Director of Coaching (mid-1990s) where he oversaw the design and implementation of athlete and coach development programs

Interbranch Team Coach and Chaperone (1994–2023) nearly three decades of mentoring junior athletes at representative level.

Kenn also represented the Central Coast on international tours to:

New Zealand (1980) – as Educational Officer training local SLS instructors

USA (1981 and 1983) – where he claimed gold in Beach Flags at both Bradley's Beach, New York, and the San Clemente Ocean Festival

Kenn has also had a distinguished competition career, with success spanning local, state, national and world titles:

Australian Titles

Silver - 50-54 yrs Beach Flags (1995-96)

Bronze - 55-59 yrs Beach Sprint (1999-2000)

NSW State Titles

Multiple Gold and Bronze in Beach Sprint, Beach Flags, and 170+ Beach Relay events (1995–1999) World Titles

Bronze - Beach Relay (1998)

Silver – 55–59 yrs Beach Flags (2000)

At the state level, Kenn served on Surf Life Saving NSW advisory panels for both powercraft operations and radio communications. He was instrumental in the introduction of UHF radios across Central Coast beaches and the sign-on/sign-off patrol procedures still in use today. Kenn also served as a judge on the NSW Lifesaver of the Year Panel (1982–83).

In 1987, he represented Australia as a delegate to the World Life Saving Congress, further cementing his influence on the global stage.

For the past 22 years, Kenn has coached beach events for Wamberal SLSC, dedicating countless hours to training Nippers and juniors, fostering a love of surf sports and competition.

Kenn Borgerson's lifelong dedication to surf lifesaving is unmatched. His leadership, passion, and service have left an enduring legacy at Wamberal and across the entire Central Coast.

Congratulations, Kenn. This Life Membership is a truly fitting recognition of an extraordinary contribution.

The 2024/2025 Financial Year has seen Wamberal Surf Lifesaving Club Go through some changes record a financial result and at the end of the financial year Wamberal is in a sustainable financial position. The audited Financial Report for the year ended 30 April 2025 shows the club recorded an Operating Surplus of \$44,708 (compared with and operating surplus of \$31,663 last financial year).


Total Revenue of \$330,519 was up by \$27,439 compared to 2023/24, mainly due to 'Higher Grants and Donations revenue Surf Life Saving NSW and Branch, and the energy and dedication shown by members of the Board in securing other grants).

Membership Revenue (dropped by 4,092 to 41,918) due to membership numbers decreasing due to cost of living pressures). Café/Function Rental revenue remain basically the same due to the CPI being low at the time of the contractual annual increase.

Total cash at the end of the period was \$180,077, was an increase compared to last year. This increase in total cash was mainly due to grant monies received and Duke of Edinburgh trip funds held

The club relies heavily on commercial rental revenue from the café and function centre. This primary revenue stream continues to be supported and diversified by strong membership fees, grants and contributions from all levels of government, and the generosity of our wonderful sponsors and donors. These income streams allow us to fund our core mission of lifesaving and building the people and skills to save lives and contribute to the community.

The club needs to extend a massive thankyou to the team at Fortunity (our Auditors and professional financial support team). Fortunity has generously sponsored the club with audit services for a number of years now and have always delivered with a very high level of quality customer service. Their help, understanding and guidance is invaluable and is deeply appreciated by Mel and I. Thanks to the entire team including Adrian, Zacary and Amber.









This season marks 5 years since I was voted in (in absence) to the Director of Administration position. At the time I had absolutely no expectation I would still be in the position today. They say time flies when having fun...

With some key changes in Executive Board members, I remain in my position shared with faces old and new; hoping to provide consistency and experience in the foundational areas of administration and compliance. Supported by a team of dedicated Executive Board of Directors and a growing Committee, this role supports the Club with governance and compliance activities, communication, publicity, coordinating meetings, membership and uniforms. With a view to succession planning and/or shared workload, I welcome anyone interested in supporting this role in to make contact and get involved.

I continue to thank each and every member of the Executive & Committee for making my role sustainable. Without their combined efforts, I would not be able to achieve club compliance and administrative progress. While I don't often single any one member out, notable thanks must go to Helen Paver in her first year as Director of Lifesaving. Helen has taken an enormous load off my role through maintaining patrol records and rosters, and will also take over management of patrol unforms. Our Finance and Administration Officer Mel McCarthy continues to provide pivotal support of administrative activities, and I thank her for her continued service.

Administration





This season we encouraged online registration for our returning membership base, which was well received. In addition to office hours, we offered several face to face weekday afternoons & nipper mornings to support new and complex registrations, and allow for uniform purchases. With a consistent 550 members last few seasons, we will retain this model for the upcoming season; with further efficiencies planned to the registration process to support our club administration. Season 25/26 sees the SLSNSW Members Portal retired and replaced with the new SLS Members Hub, which we hope will be a positive experience for all members. We remain proud to accept NSW Government Active Kids Vouchers for those eligible.

We continue to provide access to club swimwear and towels through an established 'direct purchase' agreement with Fashion Fish and Hooded respectively. This allows us to minimise stock held on site and improve cash flow within the clubs finances. A uniform working party has been formed to review and streamline clubwear going forward, with a strong focus on streamlining options with consistent theme/branding to align all competitive and supporter groups within the club.

This year our Nipper State competitors uniform was a white/salmon long sleeve polyester collared top, bringing a modern twist to the traditional club maroon. Thanks to significant fundraising initiatives throughout the season our junior State Team also received a bucket hat & drybag containing swim cap, zinc & wax. State Nipper Finalists were awarded a back hoodie with electric blue artwork designed by club member Luke Taaffe, and medallists received the coveted black wet weather jacket. Aussies competitors continued the maroon & white check business shirt of previous years, teamed with their maroon cotton range self-purchased through the year. This reduced purchase requirements to new Aussies competitors. Senior Club Award recipients received maroon equipment bags embroidered with the club logo. Age Managers, Water Safety and Officials received drybag. Paul Jennar and Life Members received a scarf. We continue to offer a range of outerwear and Wamberal branded promotional items for member purchase, are proud to work with a local manufacturers and support small business. Thankyou to Good Gear, Fashion Fish swimwear, Hooded, Finz & Paladin for you custom and support this season and we look forward to continued working relationships with our suppliers.





Administration



Club communication continues to be available through a variety of channels. Our website wamberalslsc.au is user friendly while allowing for updates throughout the season as required. We continue our public/community Facebook page, as well as several speciality interest subgroups – Nippers, Masters, Boaties and Whales. These platforms are interactive and allow engagement with members. We continue to be supported by SLSA Surfguard platform for bulk club communications out via text and email. Season 2025/26 we are improving our club communications. With many sub-groups already using WhatsApp; we will be migrating all lifesaving, nippers and competition groups to the newer and more robust WhatsApp community. This will provide us efficiencies in outbound communication while improving member protection and cybersafety aspects by reducing isolated communication channels.

We remain compliant by correctly submitting all our documentation and legal paperwork correctly to various governing bodies, the ACNC and SLSA / SLSNSW. It remains our focus to further improve our preparedness for these important milestones and work toward finalising our revised Constitution. The structure and governance required is vastly different to that of generations past. With growth in member involvement and committee positions, comes the need to review and streamline club process', including the priorities for Office support in a changing landscape. We anticipate this will provide efficiencies, promote sustainability to roles and the persons filling these, and also improve member access and engagement with the club.

We continue to rely on shared member participation to achieve continued success and I thank all who contributed last season. Your involvement was very much felt and always appreciated. Again, I challenge all members to become involved and increase their personal contribution this coming season. Training and Education

Our patrolling members are required to train to a high standard. Wamberal is a powerful and sometimes unpredictable beach, often presenting large, tricky conditions. It takes time, commitment, and often years of experience to build the confidence and skills needed to patrol a beach like ours. And it's not just the hours we see recorded in patrol logs that matter, it's the many hours behind the scenes: upskilling, requalifying, online modules, IRB training and scenarios. It's all of this, combined, that shapes the patrol teams who show up each weekend ready to keep our beach safe.

This training would not be possible without our fantastic Education Team, who work tirelessly to offer multiple courses throughout the season. Their commitment ensures our patrol members are not only qualified but confident and capable.

This season, our education team delivered:

- SRC and SRC-to-Bronze Medallion courses, with a number of our older nippers stepping up, a great sign for the future generation of lifesavers.
- Bronze Medallion courses that welcomed new members from the broader community, including several of our nipper parents.
- ART upgrades and an IRB Driver and Crew course, with strong participation from members keen to upskill and contribute more to their patrols.

A huge thank you to Bruce, Alli, Cassie, and Greg for the hours they put into training and assessing these courses. Your dedication does not go unnoticed. We're also very grateful to our expert facilitators - Craig Adams, Gordon Crabb, Toni Jones, Ken Broomfield, and Ramzy Fawzy - who generously stepped in to help deliver various course components.

The continued education of both new and existing members is essential for delivering high-quality lifesaving services on our beach. It's important that we keep offering a wide range of well-run training opportunities each season to maintain and build on our high standards.

This season we had 10 patrols on the roster, which made a huge difference to the number of shifts each team was required to cover. These conversations will continue into next season, as we work together to find the best solution, one that maintains high safety standards for our beach while also ensuring our patrolling members are well-supported and confident every time they head out on the sand.

Of course, each year we see some patrolling members move on to new adventures, so it remains vital to recruit and retain members. Next season, we'll focus on boosting member engagement through more social events and chances to connect both on and off the sand. We want patrolling to be a rewarding experience - one that keeps our returning members engaged and makes new members, especially nipper parents, feel welcome and excited to be involved.

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

SLSCC U8-U14 Junior Branch Champs Avoca Beach SLSC





Supporting Communities Beyond Patrol Hours

This season saw NSW experience a number of extreme weather events that tested the endurance and resilience of communities across the state. During these challenging times, Surf Life Saving NSW volunteers including members from Wamberal SLSC played a vital role in providing emergency response support well beyond the beach.

Earlier in the season, Tropical Cyclone Alfred threatened northern NSW and parts of Queensland, prompting the coordinated deployment of trained Flood Rescue Task Forces. These teams, consisting of up to five units with approximately 14 members each, were made up of skilled volunteers from across NSW. Their capabilities included:

IRB Drivers and Crew

Land-Based and In-Water Rescue Operators

UAV (Drone) Pilots

Logistics and Communications Personnel

Team Leaders and Task Force Commanders

Beyond the Flags

Emergency Response







These teams were tasked daily with a range of duties including welfare checks, rescues of both people and animals, medical deliveries, evacuations, and flood impact data collection.

Volunteers sacrificed their time, including unpaid workdays, and spent up to a week away from their own families to help complete strangers in need.

Soon after, the Northern Rivers region of NSW was devastated by some of the worst flooding in recent history. Many of the same volunteers who had assisted with Cyclone Alfred were redeployed to these flood-affected areas, where the damage to homes, businesses, and livestock was overwhelming.

Emergency service teams, including Surf Life Saving volunteers, worked side-by-side in the massive clean-up effort, helping residents remove flood-damaged belongings, wash out homes, and conduct damage assessments critical for recovery operations.

These deployments are a crucial part of the broader emergency response framework in NSW. Volunteers not only assist in times of crisis—they offer hope and practical help to those most in need.

For members interested in contributing to future emergency response efforts, the experience is both physically and emotionally demanding, yet incredibly rewarding. With the right training and qualifications—many of which are achievable with club support—members can be part of these life-changing operations.

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

Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act 2009, the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012, the Charitable Fundraising Act 1991 and associated regulations. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

Wamberal Surf Life Saving Club Incorporated is an association registered under the Associations Incorporations Act 2009 and domicilied in New South Wales.

The financial report is prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where stated specifically, current valuations of non-current assets.

These are special purpose financial statements that have been prepared for the purpose of complying with the Australian Charites and Not-for-profits Commissions Act 2012 and associated regulations. The Board have determined that the accounting policies adopted are appropriate to meet the needs of the members of the Wamberal Surf Life Saving Club Limited.

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the recognition and measurement requirements specified by the Australian Accounting Standards and Interpretations issued by the AASB and the disclosure requirements of AASB 101 'Presentation of Financial Statements'; AASB 107 'Statement of Cash Flows'; AASB 108 'Accounting Policies, Changes in Accounting Estimates and Errors'; AASB 1048 'Interpretations of Standards'; AASB 1054 'Australian Additional Disclosures' as appropriate for not-for-profit oriented entities.

Accounting Policies

Revenue

Revenue is recognised when it is probable that the economic benefit will flow to the company and the revenue can be reliably measured.

Sale of goods

Sale of goods revenue is recognised at the point of sale, which is when the customer takes receipt of the goods, the risks and rewards are transferred to the customer and there is a valid sales contract. Amounts disclosed as revenue are net of sales returns and discounts.

Functions and Events

Revenue from functions and events are recognised once the event is held in the Club facilities and has meet its obligations to provide a venue for the expressed purpose agreed with the parties.

Membership fees

Revenue from membership fees is recognised at time of receipt.

Grants and donations

Grant & donation income is recognised as revenue when received unless they are designated for a specific purpose, where they are carried forward as prepaid income on the balance sheet.

Interest

Interest revenue is recognised using the effective interest rate method, which for floating rate financial assets is the rate inherent in the instrument.

All revenue is stated net of the amount of goods and services tax (GST).

Notes To The Financial Statements For The Financial Year Ended 30 April 2025

Summary of Significant Accounting Policies Continued...

Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

Buildings

Buildings are measured on the cost basis and are therefore carried at cost less accumulated depreciation and any accumulated impairment losses. In the event that the carrying amount of buildings is greater than its estimated recoverable amount the decrease in value is shown in the profit and loss statement as a revaluation decrease.

Plant and Equipment / Surf Patrol Equipment

Plant and equipment are measured on the cost basis and are therefore carried at cost less accumulated depreciation and any accumulated impairment losses. In the event the carrying amount of plant and equipment is greater than its estimated recoverable amount and impairment losses are recognised in the profit or loss as revaluation decreases if the impairment losses relate to the revalued asset. A formal assessment of recoverable amount is made when impairment indicators are present.

Depreciation

The depreciable amount of all fixed assets, including buildings and capitalised lease assets is depreciated on a straight line or diminishing-value basis over the asset's useful life to the entity commencing from the time the asset is held ready for use. Leasehold improvements are depreciated over the shorter of either the unexpired period of the lease of the estimated useful lives of the improvements.

The depreciation rates used for each class of depreciable asset are:

Class of Fixed Asset	Depreciation Rate
Plant and Equipment	5-25%
Surf Patrol & Sports Equipment	10-20%

The assets' residual values and useful lives are reviewed, and adjusted if appropriate, at end of each reporting period.

Gains and losses on disposals are determined by comparing proceeds with carrying amount. These gains or losses are recognised in profit or loss in the period which they arise. When revalued assets are sold, amounts included in the revaluation reserve relating to that asset are transferred to retained earnings.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand, deposits held at-call with banks, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less, and bank overdrafts. Bank overdrafts are shown within short-term borrowings in current liabilities on the statement of financial position.

Goods and Services Tax

Revenues, expenses and assets recognised net of the amount of GST, except where the amount of GST incurred is not recoverable from the Australian Tax Office (ATO).

Receivables and payables are stated inclusive of the amount of GST receivable or payable. The net amount of GST recoverable from, or payable to, the ATO is included in other receivables or payables in the statement of financial position.

Notes To The Financial Statements For The Financial Year Ended 30 April 2025

1. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies Continued...

Income Tax

As the company is a charitable institution in the terms of subsection 50-5 of the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997, as amended, it is exempt from paying income tax.

Trade and Other Payables

Trade and other payables represent the liabilities for goods and services received by the company during the reporting period that remain unpaid at the end of the reporting period. The balance is recognised as a current liability with the amounts normally paid within 30 days of recognition of the liability.

Comparative Figures

Where required by Accounting Standards, comparative figures have been adjusted to conform with changes in presentation for the current financial year.

Critical Accounting Estimates and Judgements

Estimates and judgements are continually evaluated and are based on historical experience and other factors, including expectations of future events that may have a financial impact on the entity and that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances.

In our opinion, except for the effects of the matter described in the Basis for Qualified Opinion section of our report, the financial report of Wamberal Surf Life Saving Club Incorporated is in accordance with the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012, including:

- giving a true and fair view of the Club's financial position as at 30 April 2025 and of its performance for the year ended on that date; and
- complying with Australian Accounting Standards Reduced Disclosure Requirements and the Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Regulation 2013.
- (c) the Charitable Fundraising Act 1991, including
 - the financial report shows a true and fair view of the financial result of fundraising appeals for the year to which they relate; and
 - (ii) the financial report and associated records have been properly kept during the year in accordance with this Act and the regulations; and
 - money received as a result of fundraising appeals conducted during the year has been properly accounted for and applied in accordance with this Act and the regulations; and
 - Wamberal Surf Life Saving Club Incorporated is solvent, as it is able to pay its debts as and when they fall due.

Basis for Qualified Opinion

The financial statements of the Wamberal Surf Life Saving Club Incorporated include \$9,272 of inventories as at 30 April 2025. Fortunity Assurance did not observe the counting of physical inventories at the beginning or the end of the year, however, have assessed valuation of inventory. Due to the nature of the Club inventory, we are unable to satisfy ourselves by alternative means the inventory quantities recognised as at 30 April 2025. As a result, we were unable to determine if any adjustment with respect to the existence of inventory recorded is necessary and related impact on the income statement.

We conducted our audit in accordance with Australian Auditing Standards. Our responsibilities under those standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the Audit of the Financial Report section of our report. We are independent of the Club in accordance with the auditor independence requirements and ethical requirements of the Accounting Professional and Ethical Standards Board's APES 110 Code of Ethics for Professional accountants (the Code) that are relevant to our audit of the financial report in Australia. We have also fulfilled our other ethical responsibilities in accordance with the Code.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion.

The financial report of Wamberal Surf Life Saving Club Incorporated is a special purpose financial report that has been prepared in accordance with the accounting policies described in Note 1 to the financial report.

The Committee Members are responsible for the other information. The other information comprises the information included in the Club's annual report for the year ended 30 April 2025 but does not include the financial report or our auditor's report thereon.

Our opinion on the financial report does not cover the other information and accordingly we do not express any form of assurance conclusion thereon.

In connection with our audit of the financial report, our responsibility is to read the other information and, in doing so, consider whether the other information is materially inconsistent with the financial report or our knowledge obtained in the audit or otherwise appears materially misstated.

The Committee Members are responsible for overseeing the Club's financial reporting process.
