Tennis Anyone?

Recycling Tennis Balls is a New Environmental Initiative!

You probably never thought about it, but Americans use about 130 million tennis balls each year. The US Open alone uses over 70,000 per year and new balls are opened every few games. In a landfill, this would equate to about 7 metric tons, which could take several hundreds of years to decompose, while releasing toxic chemicals into the air! Several companies, such as reBounce and RecycleBalls, with companies in West Virginia and Vermont, are collecting used balls from sports clubs, schools and the general public (they will send you a prepaid bin to fill), to be recycled.

A large machine separates the felt from the rubber. The felt is called "Green Gold" and is crushed. It is recycled into a stucco-like product to be used to coat the outside of buildings. The rubber is crumbled, and is used in landscaping, playground surfacing, roofing tiles, and artificial turf. Still more are actually used in the creation of new tennis courts and tennis balls. There is a lot of research now being done to develop even more uses for the recycled rubber and felt, and other countries like the UK and Australia, are also developing ways to recycle tennis balls and reuse the byproducts.






