GFWC International Day of Service Saturday, September 26

In the coming months, we'll learn more about how our club plans to participate in this nationwide event. In 2025, GFWC set out on an ambitious International Day of Service to combat domestic and sexual violence in the United States and worldwide. On one day, members hosted community forums, educated citizens, read to and tutored children in shelters, prepared "go packs" for women and their children arriving at shelters, repaired and cleaned shelter facilities, and strengthened survivor-based partnerships as they collected more than \$375,000 in supplies, and donated 37,000 hours to serve those affected by domestic violence. GFWC's International Day of Service unites all GFWC clubs, States, Regions, and global affiliates behind a shared mission.

King Charles III wrapped up his state visit in April, by heading out to Shenandoah National Park in Virginia. There he sat with park rangers, swore in a group of Junior Rangers, met Buddy the bald eagle, and unveiled stones marking a new conservation partnership between Shenandoah and the Cairngorms in Scotland. This is a man who converted his estate to organic farming in 1986 and got mocked by the British press for decades for caring too loudly about the natural world. King Charles reminded us what our own national parks are worth. Our current administration is treating America's public lands like a fire sale, gutting the Roadless Rule and blowing open nearly 60 million acres of national forests to commercial logging and strip mining, while moving to sell hundreds of thousands of additional acres to private developers. I hope you will consider a visit to a National Park when planning your next vacation.

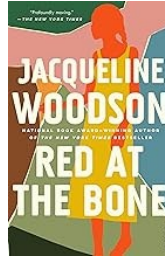

In late April, several MWC members had the pleasure of touring the **Covenant House** facility in Atlantic City which is a safe refuge for homeless teens and youths at risk for human trafficking. We delivered the 22 no-sew blankets that were crafted by our members and also brought a few sweet treats and donated ear buds to the residents. We met with Jen Williams, Community Outreach Coordinator and long-time friend of our club, who gave an overview of the facility, the mission of the program and the plight of a homeless teen in search of a safe-haven.

New Look: Marlton Farmers Market

Guess what? Major changes are coming to the Marlton Farmers Market. For the past 4 years the market has been held at Evesboro Downs Park on Wednesday evenings from 6-9 pm beginning in May. That schedule and location are both changing.

The market is moving to Kain Park at Main Street and Locust Avenue, next to Main Street Auto. The gazebo park is on Main Street. The move is meant to create a more central location and bring a sense of 'vibrancy' to the Main Street corridor. The new format will combine a farmers market with a street fair atmosphere.

The updated season will run from August 28 to November 20 and will now take place on Fridays from 5 -8 p.m. expect a larger event overall with more vendors, more farmers, and additional food trucks. 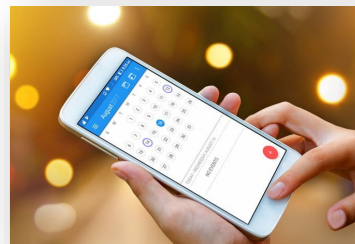
