The world has lost a champion for the environment: **Tatiana Schlossberg** was a climate change and environmental journalist and author of *Inconspicuous Consumption: The Environmental Impact You Don't Know You Have*. It's about the unseen environmental and climate impacts of the Internet and technology, food, fashion and fuel, and it won the Rachel Carson Environment Book Award in 2020. Schlossberg also freelanced for several different publications, and wrote her own newsletter, *News from a Changing Planet*. Schlossberg, who was John F. Kennedy's granddaughter, was a wife and mother who was diagnosed with a "rare mutation" of acute myeloid leukemia in 2024 after the birth of her second child.
