#### FROM THE PRESIDENT'S PEN


"The World is HUGGED ~ by the Arms of Volunteers"

## **Women's History**

Here are a few interesting happenings during the month of April:

April 2, 1931 - 17-year old Jackie Mitchell, the second woman to play baseball in the all-male minor leagues, pitched an exhibition game against the N.Y. Yankees and struck out both Babe Ruth and Lou Gehrig. The next day the baseball Commissioner voided her contract claiming baseball was too strenuous for women. The ban wasn't overturned until 1992.

**April 7, 1987** - Opening of the National Museum of Women in the Arts in Washington, D.C.

**April 13, 1933** - Ruth Bryan Owen was the first woman to represent the U.S. as a foreign minster appointed as envoy to Denmark.

**April 19, 1977** - 15 women in the House of Representatives formed the first Congressional Caucus for Women's Issues.

**April 26, 1777** - American Revolutionary heroine, Sybil Ludington at age 16, rode 40 miles on horseback in the middle of the night to warn the American militia that the British were invading.

**April 28, 1993** - The first "Take Our Daughter to Work" Day sponsored by the Ms. Foundation. In 2003, it became "Take Our Daughters and Sons to Work" Day.
