## **Women's History**

Each month I try to write about women who worked very hard to win the right to vote. However, and hard to believe, there were women who were totally against that right.

One woman, Josephine Jewell Dodge, fought against winning the right to vote. She was born in 1855 in Connecticut. She attended Vassar College for a year but then left school to go to Russia with her father who was a diplomat for the U.S. government. Later, she married and had six children.

Josephine worked at a nursery school in New York City but in 1888 she developed the Jewell Day Nursery with an emphasis on education. She spent many years working in that industry.

In 1911, she helped found and became president of the National Association Opposed to Woman Suffrage. She was also editor of their publication, "Woman's Protest." She was the target of verbal attacks at the 1915 riot in Washington, DC between suffragists and anti-suffragists. The same year, she gave a speech in New Jersey against the suffrage movement. A quote from that speech was "The life of the average woman is not so ordered as to give her first hand knowledge of those things which are

the essentials of sound government. She is worthily employed in other departments of life and the vote will not help her fill her obligations therein." Luckily, she did not succeed and the right to vote passed in 1920.

She died in 1928 at 73 years of age in Cannes, France.





The date chosen to observe International Holocaust Remembrance Day was January 27, because that was the day, in 1945, when Soviet troops from the Red Army liberated Auschwitz-Birkenau, the largest concentration camp operated by the Nazis.
